- Prepare any portfolio (if required)
- Request reference letters (Make sure you give plenty of advance notice)
- Request or print any special application forms
- Research and write essay (if applicable)
- Review and edit all pieces of application
- Make copies of all pieces of application
- Submit application in requested form (i.e., electronic, mail, etc.)
- Check with sponsor to verify they received your application and all documents
- Move on to next chronological application

DEADLINE IS OCTOBER 1

Scholarships to academically talented, highly motivated African American students who are currently seniors in high school and plan to pursue undergraduate degrees full time. Students must be US citizens or permanent US residents. Students who apply by the November 1 deadline are considered for the Ron Brown Scholar Program AND will have their application information forwarded to a select and limited number of additional scholarship providers. (Students are still responsible for applying to all scholarship programs in which they are interested) Students applying by the final deadline of January 9 will be considered for the Ron Brown Scholar Program ONLY.

Elks National Foundation – DEADLINE IS NOVEMBER 2

Eligibility requirements are: Any high school senior who is a U.S. citizen. Applications will be judged on scholarship, leadership, financial need. Applications are available September 1 at: www.elks.org/enf/scholars
