## ***Inclement Weather Policy***

In the event that it becomes necessary to close schools for the entire day because of inclement weather, the announcement will be made no later than 6:30 a.m. through the following media sources: WTTR – AM 1470, Channel 21 and Channel 3 (Westminster), as well as the major TV stations (Channels 2, 11 and 13). If weather conditions are such that the opening of schools might be delayed one hour or more, or it becomes necessary to close schools early, the notification will be made through the same stations as for the closing of schools. Pupils and parents are asked to refrain from calling the school, radio stations or the Pupil Transportation office to inquire about school closing and bus service as it may impact the handling of announcements. When schools are closed all day or close early, there will be no after school or evening events.

### **Procedures for Closing Schools for Late Openings on Two-hour and Forty-five Minute Early Dismissal Days**

#### **System-wide Two-hour and Forty-five Minute Early Dismissals**

If weather or another condition warrants a late opening on a day when a system-wide early dismissal for students is scheduled, Mr. Guthrie will close schools rather than bring students in on a delayed schedule and send them home on an early dismissal.

#### **Elementary Students Two-hour and Forty-five Minute Early Dismissals**

If weather, or another condition, warrants a late opening on days when an early dismissal is scheduled for elementary students, Mr. Guthrie will close schools **for elementary students only** rather than bring students in on a delayed schedule and send them home on an early dismissal. **Middle and High Schools will be open and operate on the announced delayed opening schedule.**

## **2012 Empty Bowls, Silent Auction and EVE Annual Art Show**

Ebb Valley Elementary School will hold its second annual "Empty Bowls" fundraiser and Annual Art Show on Friday, February 3<sup>rd</sup> from 6:00 to 9:00 pm. Bring your family and friends to support this worthwhile community event.

Empty Bowls is a fundraiser that donates all of its profits to local food banks to aide in feeding the hungry and homeless. At this event a selection of Mrs. Markle's delicious homemade soups will be served with bread. Attendees have a choice of purchasing their soup along with a handmade clay bowl that 5<sup>th</sup> grade students have constructed in art class *or* for a slightly lesser fee a Styrofoam disposable bowl.

The two major goals that this activity will achieve are to teach students how they can build and support their community through charitable acts such as the Empty Bowls project *and* giving students the opportunity to learn firsthand how the visual arts can provide a venue for community building and collaboration. These learning opportunities are genuine and supportive and can help our students earn a sense of pride in their education and what it means to be a volunteer.

In conjunction with the Empty Bowls project we will concurrently hold our annual visual arts show. Work will be displayed in our main lobby and gym. Due to limited space, art work will be 2 dimensional entries ONLY. As usual, artwork completed in school will be the major focus of the art show. If students have a project that they have completed in previous years here at school they are welcome to bring it in for display. It must be brought to school by January 26<sup>th</sup> and include the student's name and current homeroom teacher.

A brief introduction and explanation to the Empty Bowls project will be held while you dine at approximately 6:30 pm. After the introduction we encourage you to dine on a delicious selection of soups and enjoy the art show.

- Soup in a handmade clay bowl along with a serving of bread- 6.00
- Soup in a disposable Styrofoam bowl with a serving of bread- 4.00
- Refills in same bowl 3.00
- Drinks- Coffee 1.00
- Iced Tea-1.00
- Cake-1.00 per slice

We will videotape clips of Empty Bowls and the art show to be shown on Channel 21. Please let us know if you do not want your child or family to be shown on videotape.

The Eisteddfod is an all-county chorus in which all of the elementary, middle, and high schools come together for a county wide performance. It is a huge honor and privilege to be a part of this extraordinary group. The student performs with a large vocal ensemble in Westminster High School's auditorium in front of several hundred people. There is a professional CD and DVD produced of this event. The event will also be televised on Channel 21 CCTV. Mr. Meerdter will be auditioning students who would like to be a part of Eisteddfod during the second week of January after the winter break.

Audition requirements are as follows:

This Just In!

From Mrs. Spera, School Counselor

Classroom Guidance Units this month:

**Kindergarten** will identify and practice acceptable ways to deal with anger during the month of January. We will sort our ‘clean’ and ‘dirty’ anger, and prevent our Snowmen from having “meltdowns”!

**First Grade** will be working on Career Awareness and teamwork activities during the month of January.

**Second grade** will be developing knowledge about goal-formation, and building integrity and truthfulness.

**Third graders** have been learning about strategies to deter bullies as well as how to keep from using bullying behavior ourselves. Coming up next month, third graders will be participating in a study skills/organization unit entitled “STEP UP” as a part of classroom guidance.

**Fourth grade** just completed a unit on Learning Styles. Students each took a survey to determine their learning style: interpersonal, intrapersonal, musical, kinesthetic, logical/mathematical, verbal/linguistic, visual/spatial—or a combination of those. We talked about the best ways to study and memorize new information related to each learning style. We also practiced reading a sample report card, so we’re ready to interpret and pull meaning out of our own report cards the next time they come out!

**Fifth graders** just completed a unit where students developed their ability to identify and deal effectively with bullying situations. Ask your fifth grader what the “Bully Circle” is, and how the power-balance can change from negative to positive.

## Fifth Grade News January 2012

### ELA-

- The Holiday Tradition writing pieces were interesting and informative. Our fifth graders participate in a variety of traditions with their families, neighbors, and friends. In class, we focused on the writing traits of organization and sentence fluency. Mrs. Spickler and Mrs. DeStefano even shared their own family traditions as models.
- Students will take the Scholastic Reading Inventory (SRI) to determine their reading progress since September. We will send home a paper with their new score.

### Science-

**CARROLL COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS**  
**OUT-OF-DISTRICT REQUESTS FOR THE 2012 - 2013 SCHOOL YEAR**

Board policy states that students who attend Carroll County Public Schools shall attend school in their designated attendance area. However, in very specific and limited circumstances, students may be placed in a school outside their attendance area if an approvable circumstance is deemed to exist.

Parents/legal guardians desiring an out-of-district placement for their child should carefully review the list of approvable circumstances listed on the back of the out-of-district application to determine whether the child meets the criteria for approval. Please review the out-of-district regulations in the Student Services manual for updates. The information can be found in Section I of the Student Services manual at [www.carrollk12.org](http://www.carrollk12.org). The Carroll County Public Schools' out-of-district policy and regulation will be strictly adhered to in making decisions regarding admission of students to schools outside of their assigned attendance area.

It is the parent's/legal guardian's responsibility to obtain an out-of-district application from the school office or the Student Services Department. These applications will be available on December 5, 2011. Completed out-of-district applications may not be returned to the school office.

The deadline for out-of-district applications for the 2012-2013 school year is **February 1, 2012**. Completed applications must be **postmarked or personally delivered** by the deadline date to:

Step 3.—Judges review the Nomination Form & Biographical Form and select eight winners for the Chamber's Outstanding Teacher Award.

NOTE: The Chamber follows the MD Teacher of the Year guidelines so that the candidates are eligible for MD Teacher of the Year.

## Nurse Notes:

*Thank you all for your lovely cards and gifts this Christmas Season; I really appreciate the thoughts. I hope your holidays were happy and safe.*

*Remember parents need to bring in medication for your child with the signed medication form. **STUDENTS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO TRANSPORT MEDICATION OF ANY KIND.** It can result in disciplinary action.*

***Weather:** The temperature has dropped and students are still going outside for recess. Make sure your child is dressed appropriately for the outside temperature and has a coat, hat, and gloves for recess.*

*Letters will be coming home in the upcoming month for those that are missing health forms in their file, please follow-up with the appropriate physician and return the forms to the school.*

*\*Please remember to send in notes with your child regarding physical limitations to PE participation. These doctor's notes are required to be on file for injuries. **A parent note is only sufficient for 3 days then a medical doctor is needed for further excuse from PE.***

*\*\*If there have been any changes to your child's health status, please inform me of these changes. This aids in caring for your child at school. This includes medication changes, even if your child does not take any at school.*



### **Just a few reminders to all parents:**

- **Students sent home with a fever greater than 100 degrees **MAY NOT** return to school until **FEVER** free for at least 24 hours without medication.**
- **Acetaminophen and Ibuprofen** in junior/child dosing packaging are the only drugs permitted with parent signature. Any dosing above the recommended dose for weight and age will need a physician order. Forms are available in the Health Room, and on the CCPS website.
- All other **Over-the-Counter** or **Prescription** medicines will need a physician order, **No exceptions.**
- Students are **NOT PERMITTED** to transport any medications, ointments etc. to or from school.
- Parents must bring in the medicine in the **original container** with the student's name on the outside. Please make sure that all **prescription medications** are properly labeled from the pharmacy with the student's name, medication, dosage, physician's name and expiration date.
- **Reminder to all Kindergarten parents:** Please consider sending in a change of clothes for your child. The clothing will remain at school and used if needed.
- **Only the following items may come to school with your student: Chapstick/lip balms, saline eye solution, hand lotion, sunscreen, and waterless hand cleansers. Non-medicated cough-drops are also permitted. (Halls, Luden's or Ricola, for example). Medicated cough-drops have a daily dosage and a limit for a 24 hour period; these would need a physician order and be transported by an adult.**

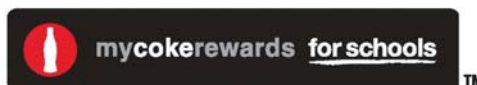

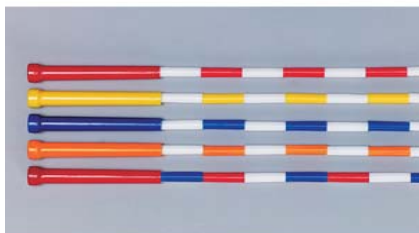
