May 2011 – Notes From the Office.....

The countdown is on. When this newsletter is published, there will be approximately 33 school days left in this school year. The year seems to have flown by and the brutal winter and crazy beginning to Spring of 2011 have passed.

We want to thank all of the staff and volunteers who helped out during our extended tornado warning on Thursday, April 28th. We allowed students to enter the building early and get off of buses and into the building right away and we remained in storm safety mode until 9:45 AM. Due to the timing of this event it became necessary to provide breakfast to students while they were waiting in the hallway. As usual our staff and volunteers pulled it off with such ease.

As we wind down this school year, there are a few reminders for parents that will help us make the days go smoother.

1. Students are allowed one AM and one PM bus stop. We cannot accept notes asking for a temporary bus change (either a bus change or a different bus stop). If you need to have your child go somewhere different than their normal after school drop off spot, you must make arrangements for that person to pick your child up at school using either office pick-up or parent pick-up.
2. If you are a chaperone on a field trip or are attending a school event and you know you are going to want to take home younger or older siblings after the event, please be sure to send in a note so your children can be added to parent pick-up. Unannounced pick-ups create quite a disruption in an already hectic time of day. Please send a note to arrange for parent pick-up.

Please pay careful attention to children when driving on school property.

With the end of the year approaching and the increase in activities, parents and visitors should be especially aware of students when driving on the school property. Mornings during arrival and evenings at dismissal time are especially busy. The speed limit in our parking lot is 5 m.p.h.

Remember – do not drop your child off until 8:10a.m.

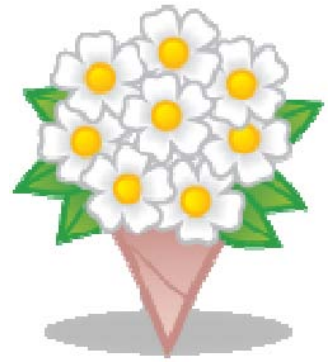

Nurse Notes:



The sun is out and is shining bright. Sunburns are prevalent in the building. Please remember to apply sunscreen to you kids and send it in with them to reapply throughout the day. The nurse DOES NOT have sunscreen to apply to your children. The students are outside for recess and PE.

Hearing and Vision Screening was April 5th thru 8th. Forms regarding need for vision follow-up were mailed home. Please have your child checked and return the form as soon as possible to the school nurse.

Physical, lead and dental forms have been sent home over the last few weeks. These forms are required in health record folders. Have the appropriate physician fill them out and return to school nurse ASAP.

Please feel free to email me with any questions or concerns with this issue.

Please remember to send in notes with your child regarding physical limitations to PE participation. These doctor's notes are required to be on file for injuries. **A parent note is only sufficient for 3 days then a medical doctor is needed for further excuse from PE.*

**Keep in mind the end of the school year is fast approaching. Medications are not kept for the next year. Pick-up medicines on or before June 16th, or they will be disposed of.*

*Remember parents need to bring in medication for your child with the signed medication form. **STUDENTS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO TRANSPORT MEDICATION OF ANY KIND.***

***If there have been any changes to your child's health status, please inform me of these changes. This aids in caring for your child at school. This includes medication changes, even if your child does not take any at school.*



Just a few reminders to all parents:

- **Students sent home with a fever greater than 100 degrees *MAY NOT* return to school until *FEVER* free for at least 24 hours without medication.**
- **Acetaminophen and Ibuprofen in junior/child dosing packaging are the only drugs permitted with parent signature. Any dosing above the recommended dose for weight and age will need a physician order. Forms are available in the Health Room, and on the CCPS website.**
- **All other Over-the-Counter or Prescription medicines will need a physician order, **No exceptions.****
- **Students are NOT PERMITTED to transport any medications, ointments etc. to or from school.**
- **Parents must bring in the medicine in the original container with the student's name on the outside. Please make sure that all prescription medications are properly labeled from the pharmacy with the student's name, medication, dosage, physician's name and expiration date.**
- **Reminder to all Kindergarten parents: Please consider sending in a change of clothes for your child. The clothing will remain at school and used if needed.**
- **Only the following items may come to school with your student: Chapstick/lip balms, saline eye solution, hand lotion, sunscreen, and waterless hand cleansers. Non-medicated cough-drops are also permitted. (Halls, Luden's or Ricola, for example). Medicated cough-drops have a daily dosage and a limit for a 24 hour period; these would need a physician order and be transported by an adult.**

Thank you for your continued cooperation, and let's hope for a healthy school year. As always, feel free to contact me with any questions.

Summer Reading

Check your child's book bag for information about the Carroll County Public Library summer reading program. Please consider signing up for this program. Ebb Valley's participation has decreased each of the last three years. This year, I would like that to change. My goal is to have at least **250** students participate this summer. Reading during the summer months is important to help students maintain their reading levels.

Give your child a break by including magazines, comic books, graphic novels, playaways, and any other materials that involve reading. Are you putting together a toy? Have your child help you read the instructions and follow the directions. When you go on a road trip have your child read the billboards along the way.

Studies have shown that summer reading loss is cumulative. Children don't "catch up" when they return to school because the other children are moving ahead with their skills instead of making up for lost time. By the end of 6th grade, children who lose reading

skills over the summer are two years behind their classmates.

Read to your child or take time to listen to your child read. This lets your child know how important it is to you. Let your child see you reading. Above all let them know that reading can be FUN!

Remember, they can earn fun prizes with their summer library bucks. Consider attending one of the FREE summer programs at the library this summer.

Help continue Ebb Valley's quest to become a community of readers.

Talent Show Audition Process: (Read Carefully)

To all who audition: The following is a list of rules that MUST be followed to be accepted into the talent show.

- ALL acts must be finalized or close to be finalized at your audition. You may not show up to an audition and just tell Mr. Meerdter what you plan on doing. Your act must be ready to go on stage at your audition. Please use the next week or so rehearsing your act to prepare for your audition.
- Make sure you remember when you signed up for a slot to audition. Mr. Meerdter can only "make-up" the student's audition if the child is absent from school on that particular date.
- If you are singing a song, your background music must be on a Karaoke CD with no other lead singers. You can find karaoke CDs at Wal*Mart or Target, but you may want to try www.amazon.com for ordering rare karaoke songs or download the mp3 for \$1. If you do this, you must give Mr. Meerdter the song on a CD. No iPods will be accepted.
- All songs must be school appropriate (language and content wise). A typed print out of all lyrics must be given to Mr. Meerdter at the start of your audition. Mr. Meerdter needs lyrics from students who are singing a song, or dancing with music in the background that have singers singing. Some students choose to play an instrument with a song. If this is the case, Mr. Meerdter will need a copy of the lyrics.
- Any background music must be given to Mr. Meerdter by May 23th on a CD. Again, no iPods will be accepted
- Students who are in a group with others who do not go to school at Ebb Valley must have approval from the administration for them to participate in the talent show. (for example, your older brother plays the guitar as you sing and he goes to North Carroll Middle)
- Also, all auditions are final, students may not re-audition. All acts must be finalized before you audition. This means your performance is almost ready to be put on stage in front of your audience. There will be certain exceptions if students are ill the day he/she auditions and are absent from school
- Audition times are posted outside of Mr. Meerdter's room. They will be held first week of May. Please prepare now for your audition!!

ELA

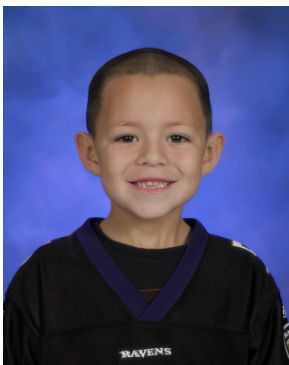

SCHOOL BANKING

Our Coke rewards total is now at 26,875. One recess kit can be purchased with 23,044 points. We would like to be able to purchase a kit for each grade level.

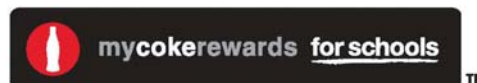

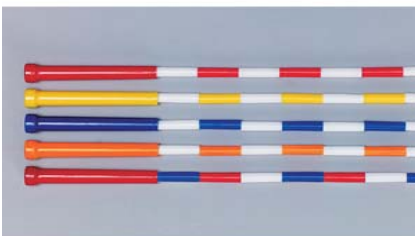

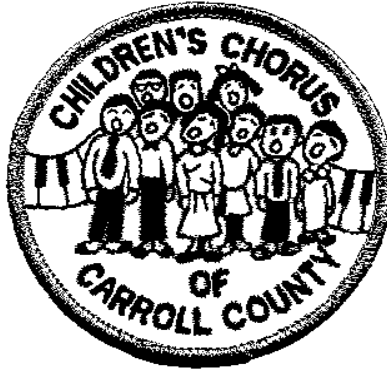
