May 2010 – Notes From the Office.....

The countdown is on. When this newsletter is published, there will be approximately 28 school days left in this school year. The year seems to have flown by and the brutal winter of 2010 is a fading memory. As we wind down this school year, there are a few reminders for parents that will help us make the days go smoother.

1. Students are allowed one AM and one PM bus stop. We cannot accept notes asking for a temporary bus change (either a bus change or a different bus stop). If you need to have your child go somewhere different than their normal after school drop off spot, you must make arrangements for that person to pick your child up at school using either office pick-up or parent pick-up.
2. If you are a chaperone on a field trip or are attending a school event and you know you are going to want to take home younger or older siblings after the event, please be sure to send in a note so your children can be added to parent pick-up. Unannounced pick-ups create quite a disruption in an already hectic time of day. Please send a note to arrange for parent pick-up.

Remember – do not drop your child off until 8:10a.m.

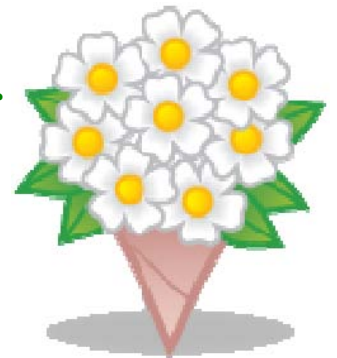

By using appropriate grammar, having daily conversations with good turn-taking, and keeping your TV or stereo at a comfortable listening volume, you lead by example. Take time daily to discuss your child's school day, read and ask questions, and seek out new vocabulary words around you, and you will support life-long learning for your children. As part of Better Hearing and Speech Month, there will be an end-of-the-year celebration the last week in May for students currently participating in the speech/language program as well as students who have "graduated" from it this school year.

Nurse Notes:



MEDICATION PICK-UP: Please remember to pick-up any medicines from the school, no later than June 10th at 3pm. Students can not transport their medications. After June 10th the medications will be discarded. I will also give you new forms for the next year to have filled out over the summer.

REMINDER: Hearing and vision screening was completed the last week in March. Re-screen day was April 30th for all absentees. This screening was for all K, 1st and 4th graders. **Follow-up forms were mailed home and needed to be returned ASAP.**

Even though the weather is getting warmer, please remember that mornings are still chilly. Continue to make sure your kids are wearing coats as needed. As the days get hotter, sunscreen needs to be applied at home in the morning, and students can bring in their own, to keep in their lockers. **They are not to share their lotions, and the nurse will not be providing lotion for them.**

Just a few reminders to all parents:

- **Students sent home with a fever greater than 100 degrees **MAY NOT** return to school until **FEVER** free for at least 24 hours without medication.**
- **Acetaminophen and Ibuprofen** are the only drugs permitted with parent signature. However, any dosing above the recommended dose for weight and age will need a physician order. Forms are available in the Health Room, and on the CCPS website.
- All other **Over-the-Counter** or **Prescription** medicines will need a physician order, **No exceptions.**
- Students are **NOT PERMITTED** to transport any medications, ointments etc. to or from school.
- Parents must bring in the medicine in the **original container** with the student's name on the outside. Please make sure that all **prescription medications** are properly labeled from the pharmacy with the student's name, medication, dosage, physician's name and expiration date.
- **Reminder to all Kindergarten parents:** Please consider sending in a change of clothes for your child. The clothing will remain at school and used if needed.
- The following items may come to school with your student: Chapstick/lip balms, saline eye solution, hand lotion, sunscreen, and waterless hand cleansers. Non-medicated cough-drops are also permitted. (Halls, Luden's or Ricola, for example). Medicated cough-drops have a daily dosage and a limit for a 24 hour period; these would need a physician order and be transported by an adult.

SIGN IN- **ALL visitors to Carroll County Public Schools must sign in and wear an ID badge.**
For Field Day, we are asking our visitors to sign at the desk under the canopy at the front of the school. Sign in, fill out a name tag and wear it. The name tag will be your ID badge for the day. Extra maps and schedules will be available at this area as well. We would like to thank you very much for your assistance in signing in.

WEATHER- If the weather is questionable, a postponement will be made on WTTR (1470 AM) and WHVR (1280 AM). Please **do not** call the school or the radio station. Every effort will be made to have the announcement made before 7:00 A.M.

Since we are going to have a beautiful sunny day, please take precautions from the sun. A sunscreen application may not be a bad idea and students may wear a hat and sunglasses while outside if they wish.

Students may bring a water bottle to school for the day. There will be a water table for refills if necessary. Additionally, students may want to bring in a beach towel to sit on to be more comfortable while watching their classmates participate in their activities.

PARKING: Parking will be in the regular parking lot, around the outside of the bus loop, including up near the school (**once busses have completed drop off**) and **ONLY ON THE EAST SIDE OF SWIPER ROAD**. Classroom Counseling this month:

Kindergarteners have completed a unit on appreciating diversity, working together, and career awareness. Ask your kindergartener about the "Squares are not all Bad" story, in which the shapes who once disliked one another because of their differences, learned that they could make beautiful artwork by working as a team!

First Graders also developed their appreciation of their own uniqueness and the diversity around them, through the creation of self-portraits and identifying the unique environments that bring them "peace".

Second grade has recently completed a career awareness and strength identification unit. We built strengths-vocabulary (gifts and talents) and found out that our strengths can impact our career futures!

Third grade is developing their personal awareness in the area of reputations and how our actions and attitudes feed our reputations. We will also be extending those concepts to include how our choices now can impact our future plans (career awareness).

Fourth grade is working on career awareness. We will be creating a "job wheel" to describe our current job: student. We will also discuss our career "dreams" and how to make those dreams reality someday (connecting our dreams/goals with our daily practices)!

Fifth graders are developing knowledge, skills and attitudes in the areas of Social Empathy and Social Leadership. We reflected on what it feels to be lonely, our experiences with loneliness, and how we want others to support us in that situation. We also talked about how to reach out to someone in need. We discussed social decision-making now and in middle school, and talked about 'social leaders' and the risks that they take by following their hearts/minds instead of "the crowd". Looking ahead, fifth grade students will be developing their awareness of middle school expectations/routines soon!

Talent Show News

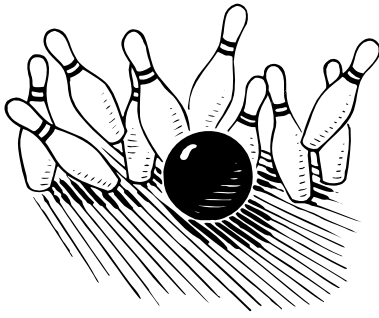
Ebb Valley will be hosting the 2nd annual talent show on **Wednesday, June 2nd** from 6:30-8:00 P.M. This talent show is a fund raiser for the music department and includes students in grades 2-5. The funds we raise go directly to new instruments, music, and future field trips. Tickets are \$3 for students and \$5 for adults and will be sold at the door. If your child is a part of the show, they can come for free; however, if you would like to make a donation that would be extremely appreciated!

The following is a list of rules that MUST be followed to be accepted into the talent show.

- ALL acts must be finalized or close to be finalized at your audition. You may not show up to an audition and just tell Mr. Meerdter what you plan on doing. Your act must be ready to go on stage at your audition. Please use the next week or so rehearsing your act to prepare for your audition.
- Make sure you remember when you signed up for your audition. Mr. Meerdter can only "make-up" the student's audition if the child is absent from school on that particular date.
- If you are singing a song, your background music must be on a Karaoke CD with no other lead singers. You can find karaoke CDs at Wal*Mart or Target, but you may want to try www.amazon.com for ordering rare karaoke songs or download the mp3 for \$1. If you do this, you must give Mr. Meerdter the song on a CD. No iPods will be accepted.
- All songs must be school appropriate (language and content wise). A typed print out of all lyrics must be given to Mr. Meerdter at the start of your audition. Mr. Meerdter needs lyrics from students who are singing a song, as well as those dancing to music in the background that have singers singing. Some students choose to play an instrument along with a song. If this is the case, Mr. Meerdter will need a copy of the lyrics of that song.
- Any background music must be given to Mr. Meerdter by Monday May 24th on a CD. No iPods will be accepted
- Students who are in a group with others who do not go to school at Ebb Valley must have approval from the administration for them to participate in the talent show. (i.e. your older brother plays the guitar as you sing and he goes to North Carroll High)
- Also, all auditions are final, students may not re-audition. All acts must be finalized before you audition. There will be certain exceptions if students are ill the day he/she auditions and are absent from school

Joseph and John Visit Ebb Valley Elementary

On April 6, the Ebb Valley family was pleased to host our old friend, Joseph Ole Tipanko and his friend John Parsitau from the Maasai community in Kenya for a wonderful cultural visit. These Maasai warriors talked about their culture, taught the students traditional dance, taught counting and jumping, and spoke of their peaceful lives as herdsman and farmers. The fourth and fifth grade students had an additional special opportunity to learn the art of Maasai beadwork as they made friendship bracelets under the direction of John.



The men also talked to our students about their efforts to make education more available for all Maasai children. The students listened attentively as Joseph and John explained that education is not free in Kenya. Many Maasai families do not have the money needed to buy school uniforms which are mandatory for a child to be allowed to attend school. Other families need the help of their children at home to take care of the livestock or to take care of younger brothers and sisters and so they are not able to attend school. Joseph and John are working to create funds that can be used to make educational opportunities available to all Maasai children and they are working to help Maasai parents realize the importance and value of sending their children to school.

As a part of this cultural visit Ebb Valley partnered with Manchester to raise money for our sister Maasai community in Kenya. Together the schools sent \$3240 to the Maasai community last week. These funds came from the children, from the PTAs at both schools and from the sale of the beautiful Maasai jewelry at the evening presentation. We look forward to the reports that Joseph and John will send us with news of the new school room they will build with these funds and we look forward to a return visit from Joseph and John next year.



Service Learning Information for Parents of Fifth Graders.....

The Service-Learning Graduation Requirement requires students to earn a minimum of 75 service-learning hours prior to graduation from high school. Students in Carroll County can begin earning service-learning hours the summer after fifth grade and have until their senior year to accumulate their hours. JUNIORS must have a minimum of 55 service-learning hours by the end of their JUNIOR year in order to have SENIOR status. Students earn hours for service-learning activities within designated courses as outlined in the Carroll County Service-Learning Guidelines as well as by independently volunteering in the community.

Remember the following guidelines when choosing a volunteer opportunity:

- X You may not be paid for your service.
- X You may not earn service hours providing service to a for-profit business.(Nursing Homes are an exception)
- X You may not earn service-learning hours for service in preparation for or during the worship service or religious education activities. Service such as helping with church dinners and mission work is acceptable.
- X Fulfilling family obligations i.e. babysitting, grass cutting etc. is not acceptable.
- X Service-Learning Reflection Forms must be completed and returned to the school within ONE YEAR from the time the service is completed.
- X Service-Learning forms can be found by accessing the following website:
