All students have taken the county January Math Benchmark Assessment and, all students have completed their January reading assessments. In addition, students in grades 3, 4 and 5 have completed a county written language assessment. The data from these assessments along with report card data will be utilized to monitor your child's progress as well as for targeting instruction.

In March, our third through fifth grade students will be taking the Maryland School Assessment Tests (MSA) in both reading and math. We ask that you make any medical or dental appointments for your students on days other than the testing days if at all possible. Reading tests will be administered on March 14th and March 15th while the MSA Math will be administered on March 20th and March 21st.

I would like to formally welcome Mrs. Jennifer Miller who replaced Mrs. Wysong in first grade. I would also like to welcome Mr. Michael Scalzi to the Friendship Valley campus as PRIDE's newest Intervention Specialist. Mr. Scalzi replaced Mrs. Doan who is now working in a

Pupil Personnel Worker capacity for Carroll County Public Schools. We also welcome Mrs. Trojanowksi who is our new Behavior Support Specialist. Mrs. Trojanowski works with us to assist students and families.

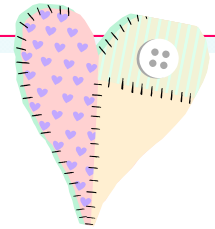

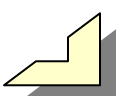
Parked cars should not be left in the car drop off line; running cars without drivers are a safety hazard. Please be courteous to the other parents and to our buses by following this procedure.

Kindergarten Enrollment Week...



Please share this information with your family, friends, and neighbors who may have a child ready to enter kindergarten:

Registration for kindergarten for the 2012-2013 school year will be held the week of **March 26 - 30, 2012** at the elementary school in your attendance area. Enrollment in kindergarten is mandatory for children who will be five years of age on or before September 1, 2012. **Kindergarten registration for Friendship Valley will be between the hours of 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. in the main lobby.** If you have the questions about kindergarten, please contact Donna Buppert at 410-751-3650.

Parents will need to present the following at the time of registration:

Parent/Guardian's photo I.D.

Child's proof of age: Birth Certificate, Birth Registration, or Passport/Visa

Verification of Residence: Recent bill for services to the home*, **signed** lease on a home/apartment to be rented/leased, a current rent receipt*, mortgage statement/bill*, property tax document from the fiscal year for primary residence, **signed** settlement document*, deed (must show house number) or a residence verification statement accompanied by an acceptable proof of residency of the owner/lessee of the property.

*Date on document must be within 60 days of enrollment)



Inclement Weather Policy...

All public schools in Carroll County will be closed on days when inclement weather conditions warrant. The decision to close schools is made by the Superintendent and announcements, if at all possible, will be made no later than 6:00 a.m. This determination is made after consulting with weather forecasters, the State Police, highway departments, and other sources in different parts of the county.

If the opening of schools must be delayed or schools must be closed early, notification will be made through radio and television stations that are listed in the CCPS calendar. Parents will also receive an AlertNow phone message and e-mail notification. No announcement will be made when schools are on a regular schedule.

When schools are closed due to inclement weather, all activities shall be canceled. All activities scheduled for weekends and/or holidays shall be canceled if the snow emergency plan is in effect at any time the day of or still in effect after 8:00 p.m. the day prior to the scheduled event. Unless required for school-based activities, snow removal should not be expected and appropriate precautions taken by users.

Parents and pupils are urged **not** to call the stations or the Board of Education office to inquire about school

closings. On days when elementary schools are scheduled to have a 2hr. and 45 min. early dismissal and schools are delayed in the morning due to inclement weather, there will be no school that day for elementary school students.

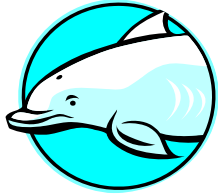

Reminders...

Please provide a spoon or fork when packing your child's lunch. We only have a supply for students buying lunch.

Nutrition Tidbits

Student Services News...*Proof of Residence*

Very often students' addresses change during the course of the school year, and parents/guardians are unaware of the procedures necessary to change their children's records. (Please know that if you do move out of the Friendship Valley attendance area during the school year, with the permission of our Pupil Personnel Worker, Mr. Mark Bugbee, your child **MAY BE PERMITTED TO STAY FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE SCHOOL YEAR.**) **ALL** address changes must be documented by an appropriate proof of residence as mandated by state guidelines.

Acceptable documents for proof of residence include:

- ~ A signed rental/lease agreement on a home/apartment in which you are residing;
- ~ Rent Receipt*;
- ~ Recent bill* of service delivered to the residence (i.e., electric, land-line phone, cable, oil or water);
- ~ Recent mortgage statement/bill specifically notating Primary Residence;
- ~ Signed Settlement Document;
- ~ Deed (must show house number, street name and name of parent/legal guardian);
- ~ Residence Verification Statement accompanied by an acceptable proof of residency for the owner/lessee of the property.

*Date on document must be within 60 days of enrollment.

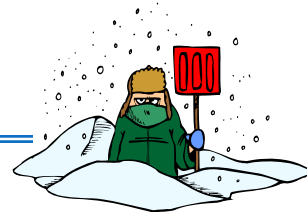
Once said document is received, the student's records will be updated.

We are very excited about what takes place here throughout the day. If you would like to join us and volunteer in the Media Center, please give us a call (410-751-3650). Thanks for your support!

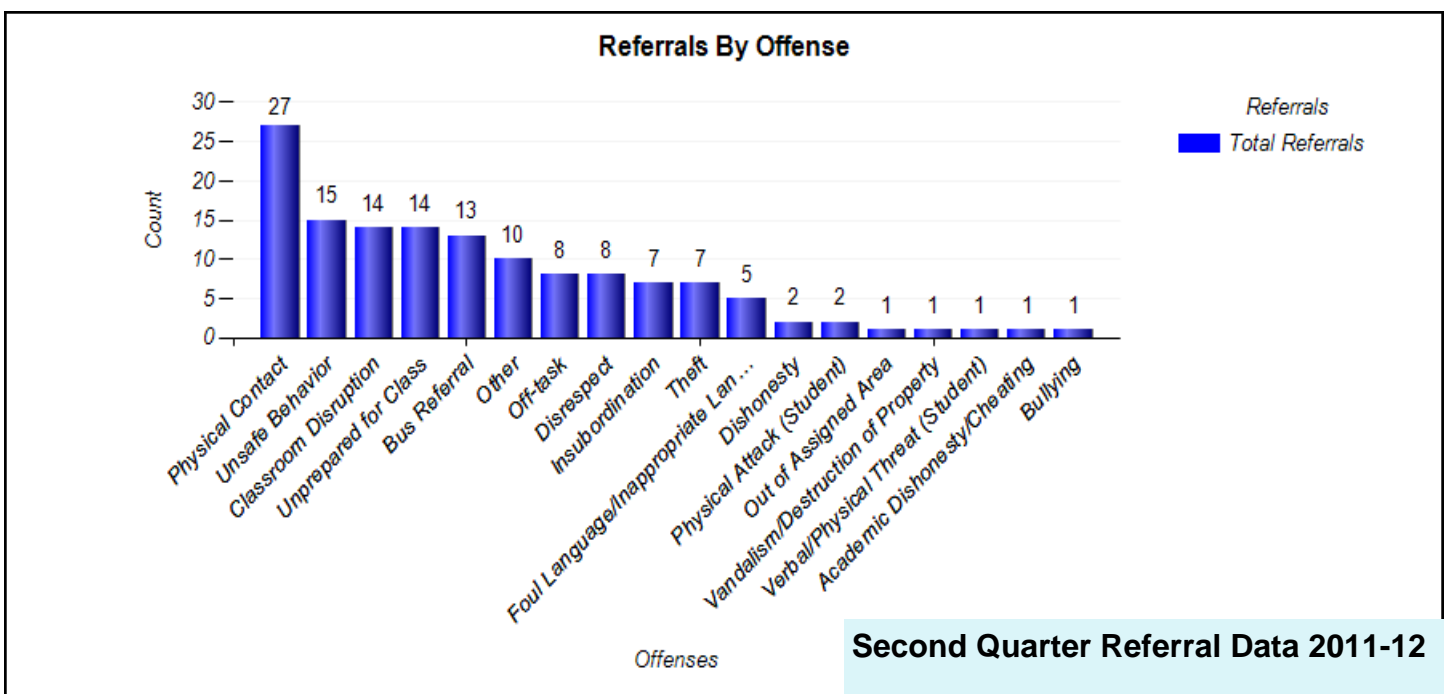
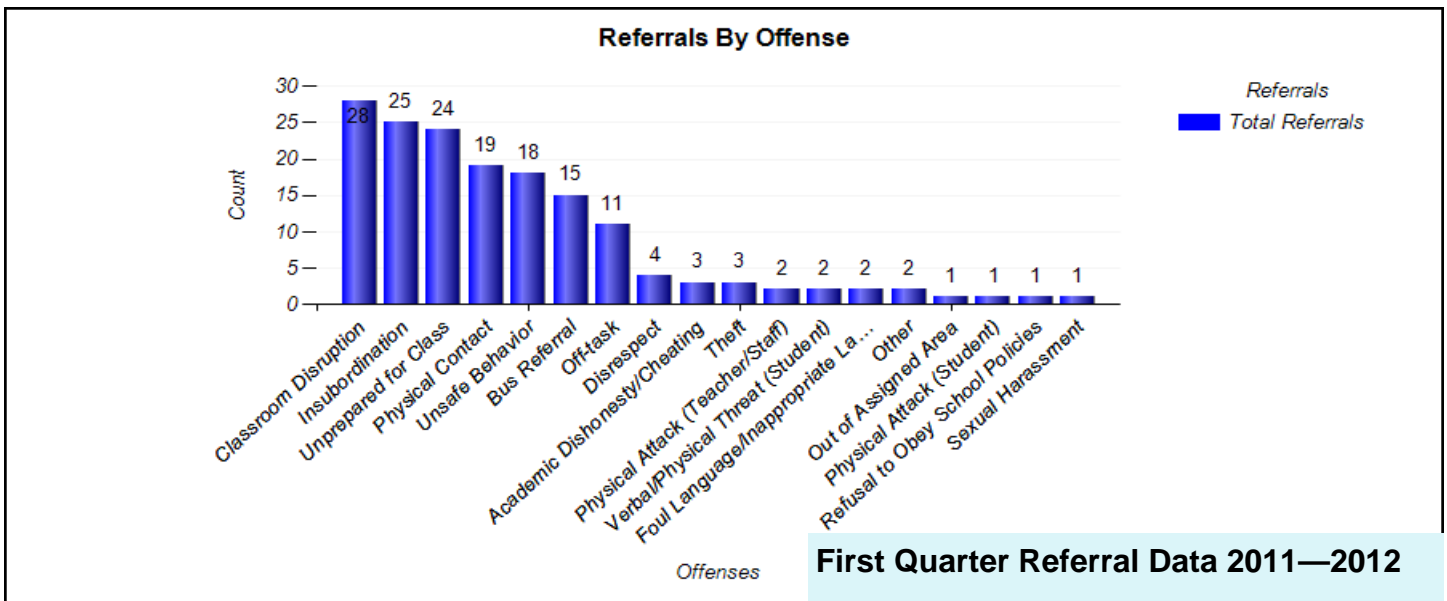
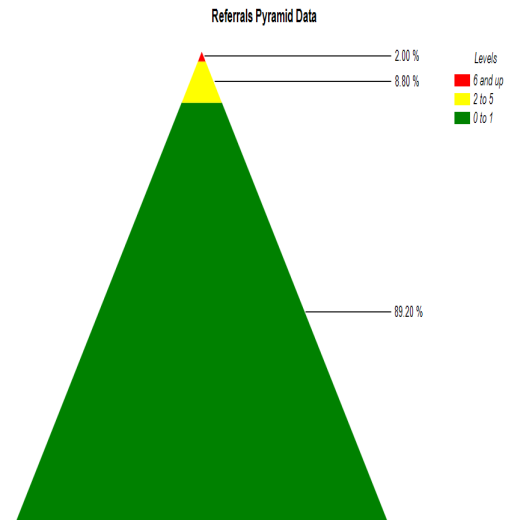


PBIS and Dynamic Dolphins
