Welcome Back! Hope you had a wonderful summer vacation. Be sure to mark your calendars for our Open House and Back to School Nights.

Mr. Dunkleberger and I, along with our entire staff, are looking forward to another year of tremendous growth and learning for our students and each of us. We are confident that you will support our efforts and encourage your child's learning.

At the beginning of the school year, teachers will be building a foundation for focused instruction in all subject areas. Successful instruction requires that teachers create a learning environment where students can learn essential skills and also engage in higher level thinking. For basic reading, reading comprehension, writing and mathematics instruction to be successful teachers need to establish and communicate daily procedures and routines. Together students and teachers also need to establish learning and behavior expectations as well as instructional goals. To that end, teachers will not only establish behavior and learning expectations and goals, but also assess student abilities and

interests, modeling think-alouds, establish literacy centers and/or independent reading guidelines, teach or review guidelines for independently choosing the "just right" book, and begin whole group literacy study. Writer's notebooks will be modeled; spelling and informal writing assessments will be completed. Formal reading assessments will be given to students quarterly.

Children's reading levels sometimes change dramatically over the summer especially if they have read a great deal. Please understand that this may require us to change reading teachers or even classes to get just the right instructional match. We will keep you informed of our decisions along the way and we certainly appreciate your understanding.

Please welcome Mrs. Melissa Stickles who is replacing Mrs. Proctor in our first grade. Mrs. Stickles spent part of last year with us as Mrs. Wingate's long term substitute teacher. We are very happy to have her join our staff.

Important School Policies:

Be sure to send in notes for your child's absence in a timely manner. If we do not receive a note within 5 days the absence becomes unlawful and will remain that way until we receive verification of the reason for the absence. **All requests for absences due to travel or vacation MUST be sent to the principal for approval PRIOR to the absence.**

Attendance is closely tied to academic performance so please have your children in school each and every day possible.

CCPS Volunteer Program—Making a Difference Together

Volunteering is an excellent way for parents and family, community members, and business partners to build and strengthen ties with the CCPS system.

CCPS Volunteer Program Guidelines outline consistent standards for volunteers. Level I Volunteers (guest readers, concession stand operators, business representatives, event ticket collectors, guest speakers, etc.) must annually register at a school site before volunteering. Level II Volunteers (classroom helpers, tutors, chaperones, mentors, etc.) are required to attend an annual training session at least seven (7) school days prior to volunteering.

Volunteer training sessions are held at schools and regional locations throughout the school year. Volunteer training, obtained during the 2009-10 school year is only valid through September 30, 2010. As plans for the 2010-11 school year are developed, volunteer training may be included as part of a scheduled school event or activity. Carefully scan school newsletters and

bulletins for planned volunteer training dates and locations. Attending required annual volunteer training prior to October 1, 2010 will maintain your eligibility to volunteer and alleviate gaps in your volunteer service. Nurse Notes by Ms. Devaux, R.N.

The school nurse cannot dispense any medications except ibuprofen and acetaminophen without a medication permission form signed by a physician and parent.

The CC BOE feels that if possible, alternate plans should be made to avoid the administration of prescription or non-prescription medications in school. Parents should be encouraged to consult with their physicians to discuss the possibility of administering medication either before or after school. However, there are occasions when it is determined by a physician or dentist that a child must receive prescribed medication during the school day, either on a regular schedule or in the event of an emergency (bee stings, asthma or diabetes).

When these circumstances occur, the physician or den-

tist must give written approval and specific directions regarding administration. No medication will be administered unless it is in the original container with appropriate written permission and directions.

All medications must be brought to school by a responsible adult. ALL medications except children's strength ibuprofen and acetaminophen must be accompanied by a medication consent form completed by a prescribing physician or nurse practitioner (not be a physician's assistant), and the parent. **ANY STUDENT WHO TRANSPORTS MEDICATION TO SCHOOL, PRESCRIPTION OR NON-PRESCRIPTION, WILL BE IN VIOLATION OF THE DRUG AND ALCOHOL POLICY.**

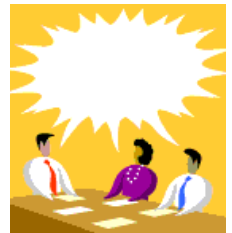

Bus Riders & Parent Pick Up & Playtime



Bus Riders:

Parents, please put your child on the school bus the first day of school if at all possible. When parents bring students into school the first day, there are many students who have no idea what bus to ride home. Parents actually do a disservice to your child by bringing them to school. Please make sure your children know the bus they are riding in to school and the bus that takes them home. If your child comes in on one bus and rides a different bus home, please also send a note with your child that first day of school listing both bus numbers.

Video/audio cameras are placed on school buses to protect students and staff and provide for a safe and orderly environment. The privacy of students and the recording are kept secure and are reviewed only by the authorized CCPS Personnel.

Parent Pick Up:

If your child is going to be a permanent pick up at the

end of each day, you will need to send in a note the first day of school stating: please put my child on the parent pick up list for the entire school year. If your child was parent pick up the previous year, you must send a note for the current school year. We no longer have notes from previous years.

If your child needs to be picked up on certain days and it is consistent (i.e., every Tuesday, Wed, etc.) also put that in writing and your child will be put on that specific day throughout the school year.

Children's names WILL NOT be called on the PA system at the end of the day. You must inform your child when they are to be parent pick up. Only names received after 11:00 am will be announced.

Playtime:

If your child attends Playtime daycare at Hampstead Elementary, please send a note whether your child is Before and After Daycare or just Before or After.

Permission to Photograph, Videotape or Audiotape

Throughout the school year, the Carroll County Public School System frequently covers school activities and may use your child's photograph, video image, or voice for educational, information, or public relations purposes, with or without identification by name.

If you do not wish to have your child's voice reproduced on tape or to have his/her image appear in such things as a video, a photograph, or the school website, please notify the school principal in writing. It is assumed that parents and guardians consent to their children being audiotaped, photographed, videotaped, or having their image placed on school website by the school system unless such notification is received.

There are also occasions when the media cover certain school events (such as when a government leader visits a school). If you do not wish to have your child's name

or likeness published by the media, you should address your concerns directly to the school involved so that the media is so advised. Please be advised that the school system has no control over the media when they are covering activities such as sporting events and musical programs that are open to the public.

Use of Student Work on Websites or in Publications

There may be times throughout the year when the CCPS wishes to display work on school websites or in publications. If you do not wish to have your child's art, poetry, writing, etc. appear on school websites or in publications, please notify the principal in writing. It is assumed that parents and guardians consent to their child's work being displayed on school websites or in publications unless such notification is received.

AlertNow



The Carroll County Public School System is now using the AlertNow Rapid Communication Service to provide parents with information from their child's schools and the school system. AlertNow is capable of delivering both e-mail and phone alerts at no charge to parents. You do not have to sign up for the system. All information is taken from emergency procedure cards.

Monthly newsletters will be sent via AlertNow and will be posed on our school website.
