The Class of 2009 had one Maryland Distinguished Scholar Finalist, three Semi-Finalists and 31 students received honorable mention. There was one appointment to a military academy.

Student Activities Programs

Liberty High School offers a broad program in interscholastic sports including Volleyball, Football, Boys' Soccer, Girls' Soccer, Golf, Cross Country, Field Hockey, Cheerleading, Boys' Basketball, Girls' Basketball, Wrestling, Indoor Track, Baseball, Softball, Boys' Lacrosse, Girls' Lacrosse, Tennis, and Outdoor Track. Students in the class of 2009 have earned County Championships in Girls' Lacrosse, Girls' Tennis and Boys' Tennis. Recent Conference Championships have been earned in Girls' Lacrosse, Boys' Soccer, Boys' Tennis, Girls' Tennis and Golf. Regional Championships were won in Boys' Soccer and Volleyball. In addition a State Finalist was earned in Boys' Soccer and a State Championship was won in Volleyball.

Liberty High School students have the opportunity to participate in the following clubs and organizations: Academic Challenge, Allies Club, Art Club, Audiovisual Club, Book Discussion, Classes, Debate Club, Destination Imagination, Drama Club, FBLA, FCA, FFA, French Club, German Club, Hebrew Club, Key Club, Manga Club, National Honor Society, Peer Facilitating, Photography, Robotics, Russian Club, Science Club, Shakespeare Club, Ski and Snowboard Club, Spanish Club, Student Government Association, Tri-M Music Honor Society, Varsity Club, Writer's Club and Yearbook.

Also available are various musical groups including Honors Wind Ensemble, Honors Symphonic Band, Concert Band, Percussion Ensemble, Honors Orchestra, Honors Jazz Ensemble as well as musical classes, namely, Chorus, Honors Chorus, Honors Festival Chorus and Honors Vocal Ensemble. Chorus received an excellent rating at the Kings Dominion Choral Festival, Concert Choir received an excellent rating and the Vocal Ensemble received a superior rating at the county choral festival. The Instrumental Music Department has various performing ensembles that perform the highest quality wind and orchestral literature, among them are the Honors Wind Ensemble, Honors Symphonic Band, Honors Orchestra, Percussion Ensemble, Honors Jazz Ensemble, "Lion's Pride" Marching Band and Indoor Guard. The 2008-2009 "Lion's Pride" Marching Band won the TOB Chapter V Championships. They also placed eighth at the TOB Atlantic Coast Championships. The Honors Wind Ensemble and Honors Orchestra received superior ratings at the Carroll District Festival and excellent ratings at the MD State Band and Orchestra Festival. The band also received superior ratings at the Festival of Music competition in May.
