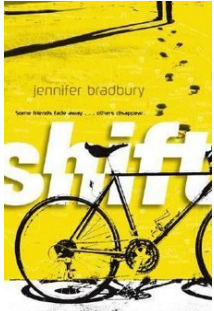

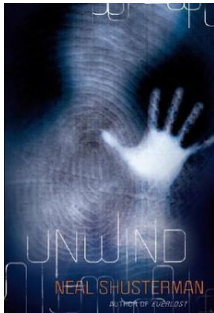
When best friends Chris and Win go on a cross country bicycle trek the summer after graduating and only one return, the FBI wants to know what happened.



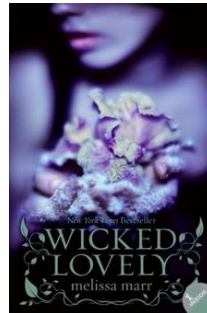

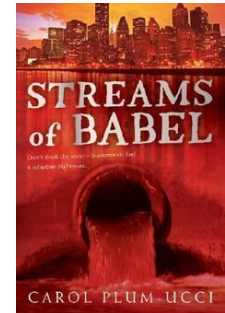
When a teenage boy replaces his injured brother in the family racecar, he must decide if he can continue his love of trumpet playing and be a Nascar racer.



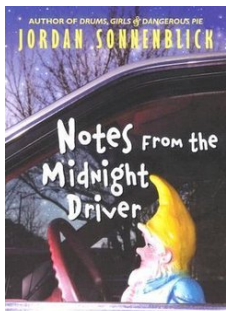
