## High School Summer School Program

In order to meet the demands of a tight budget, Carroll County Public Schools will offer a scaled down version of summer school for high school students. Each high school will offer a remediation program for their students in grades 9-12 that plan to take the summer administration of the High School Assessment (HSA).

Summer school courses associated with the High School Assessments will occur July 11-22, 2011 at Manchester Valley High School. Sessions will run from 8-10 (English and Biology) and 10-12 (Algebra and Biology). These courses are designed to help students study and review for the High School Assessments they need to pass, and if necessary, work on a Bridge Project. The courses are free of charge and open to all MVHS and NCHS students. Students that participate are expected to attend every day and sit for the High School Assessment associated with his/her course the week of July 24th. Please contact Shannon Zepp ([slzepp@carrollk12.org](mailto:slzepp@carrollk12.org)) or your student's counselor with any questions.

Credit recovery courses will only be available for rising seniors (students with the potential to graduate in June 2012) or non-graduates in the class of 2011. This credit recovery program will be offered through the Distance Learning Lab in Westminster on the campus of The Gateway School. **Tuition of \$175.00 will be charged for each credit recovery course, regardless of credit value.** There will be no fee charged for the remediation provided at individual high schools prior to summer testing.

Pre-registration is required for all of these summer options (**see attached form**). Registration packets are available in all high school counseling offices. Underclassmen in need of credit recovery options should make an appointment with their school counselor to discuss options available during the 2011-12 school year.

The Carson Scholars Fund is a non-profit organization founded in 1994 by Johns Hopkins pediatric neurosurgeon Dr. Benjamin Carson and his wife, Candy. The Fund awards \$1,000 college scholarships to students in grades 4-11 who excel academically and are dedicated to serving their communities. Students then receive the honor of being named Carson Scholars and are awarded with an Olympic-sized medal and a trophy for their school to celebrate their accomplishments. Previous winners of Carson Scholarships are eligible to reapply for the scholarship annually, as long as they consistently maintain high academic standards.

An interested student must be nominated by the principal at his or her school to be able to compete for a Carson Scholarship. Only one student from each school is able to apply, ensuring that each nominee epitomizes academic excellence. Carson Scholars must have a GPA of 3.75 and display humanitarian qualities through community service. Scholarships are awarded solely on the basis of academic achievement and humanitarian qualities, without regard to financial need or ethnicity.

### Attention Parents of All MVHS Athletes!

Manchester Valley High School will be conducting a strength and speed training program throughout the summer, **June 20<sup>th</sup> — August 5<sup>th</sup>**. Students will have the opportunity to attend 7 training sessions per week during the morning and evening.

We are looking forward to the fall sports season in 2011 at Manchester Valley High School. Practice for cheerleading, girls & boys cross country, field hockey, football, golf, girls & boys soccer and volleyball can start on Saturday, August 13, 2011. Practice/meeting times for each sport are part of this newsletter.

Each student-athlete must have a completed physical exam with the completed **new** blue Health Examination Form, prior to August 13<sup>th</sup>. ## Enrolling a New Student at Manchester Valley?

Summer meetings with counselors are available **BY APPOINTMENT ONLY**.

Parents who wish to enroll their students in MVHS will need to take the following steps and are encouraged to visit the school website for additional information:

Telephone our School Counseling office at 410-386-1674 to make an appointment with a Guidance Counselor.

At the time of the appointment, provide the following documentation:

**Proof of Residency:** Please provide us with acceptable proof of legal residence that is less than 60 days old. Acceptable documentation includes:

- \* Signed contract on a home being built in Carroll County for families with approved non-resident or out-of-district status. Must be followed by another acceptable proof of residence once the family moves into the county or the district;
- \* Signed lease/rental agreement on a home/apartment in which the parent/legal guardian is currently residing;
- \* Current rent receipt;
- \* Recent bill for a service delivered to the residence, (i.e., BGE, land-line phone, cable, oil, water);
- \* Mortgage statement / bill;
- \* Signed settlement document;
- \* Property tax bill from the current fiscal year indicating “primary residence” ;
- \* Notarized Residence Verification Statement accompanied by an acceptable proof of residence for the owner/ leasee of the property;
- \* Deed (must show house number and street name – plat information is not acceptable).

**Legal Proof of Birth/Age:** Student’s birth certificate, birth registration, hospital certificate, Physician’s certificate, Baptismal or church certification, Passport/Visa, Parent’s affidavit (with approval from Pupil Personnel Worker), Official court document indicating child’s birth date.

**Proof of Immunizations:** Official health clinic/Physician’s record with student’s name and date of birth or DHMH 896, completed and signed by medical professional.

**Course record or report cards from previous school, if available.**

Only the following persons can enroll a student and should present a form of picture ID: Biological parent; Custodial parent; Adoptive parent; Court appointed legal guardian (must have a court order with judge’s signature).

# Tips for Prevention and Addressing Cyber Bullying

## What is Cyber bullying?

- Sending mean, threatening or vulgar messages or images
- Posting private information about a person
- Pretending to be someone else to make a person look bad
- Intentionally excluding someone
- Creating a hate group or page intended to hurt someone

## How does Cyber bullying occur?

- Texts            Instant messaging
- Emails          Web pages
- Blogs            Chat Rooms
- Other informational technologies

## How to Prevent Cyber bullying:

- Keep your computer in a central, visible location in your home.
- Keep up with and speak regularly to your child about his/her online and cell phone activities. Make sure you specifically address what cyber bullying is and encourage your child to tell someone right away if they are a victim or know of a victim.
- Explain that Cyber bullying is harmful and make your expectations clear for your child's behavior with technology.

## What to do if your child has been a victim of Cyber bullying

- Encourage your child not to respond to the messages.
- Do not erase messages or images (this can be evidence).
- Try to identify the source of the bullying by contacting the internet provider or cell phone company.
- If you suspect the behavior is criminal, contact the police and let them track the source.
- File a complaint with the internet provider (i.e., MySpace or Face book) or your cell phone company because this behavior may be violating their "Terms of Use".
- If you know the source, block the person from having contact.
- If cyber bullying is occurring through school computers or during the school day, let school administrators know. It is also a good idea to let them know if it is occurring off campus because this behavior can often carry over into school.
- Consider contacting the cyber bully's parents. But be careful—some parents will react with concern and want to stop the bullying behavior, but others may react very badly. If you decide to contact the parent, it is best to do it in writing and provide proof of the behavior.
- Consider contacting an attorney.

## Always contact the police if cyber bullying involves:

- Threats            Obscene messages /harassing messages
- Extortion          Child porn
