

SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP BULLETIN

The following scholarships applications are available in the School Counseling Office or on the Internet. If you are interested in receiving an application or further information about one of the listed scholarships, stop in the counseling office. Also check the websites of the college(s) you are looking at applying to attend. Many colleges have scholarships that you can apply to if you get accepted.

- 1. AMERICAN LEGION SCHOLARSHIPS FOR VETERAN'S DEPENDENTS-** Child/Children, or legally adopted child/children of active duty US Military and Guard, Reserve personnel who were federalized and died on active duty on or after September 11, 2001 is eligible for this scholarship. A student must be a high school senior or high school graduate to apply for the scholarship. Scholarships is for undergraduate study at a US school of high education. For more information and an application, go to <http://www.legion.org/programs/resources/scholarships> or pick one up in the Counseling Office. **Deadline is April 15, 2010.**
- 2. ANYCOLLEGE.COM SCHOLARSHIP** – A college search engine that lists over 5,500 accredited colleges and universities in the U.S. Student may also sign up to win a \$1,000 scholarship, drawn four times per year. The site is free. Check in “Win a Scholarship” to sign up to win. Check www.anycollege.com for information.
- 3. AXA ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM** – 52 \$10,000 scholarships to graduating seniors (one from each state, Washington, D.C. and Puerto Rico). Additional scholarships to 10 National recipients. Students should be well rounded, determined to succeed and have demonstrated achievement. Additional information and an application may be downloaded at www.axa-achievement.com. **Deadline: February 15, 2010.**
- 4. BALTIMORE COMMUNITY FOUNDATION-** Three separate scholarships are available to North Carroll Students through the Baltimore Community Foundation.
 1. Christa McAuliffe Scholarship- The scholarship is for aspiring teachers in the State of Maryland. Seniors must be planning on attending a college in Maryland and intend to teach in Maryland. Scholarship is \$1000 and can be renewable.
 2. Al Sanders Foundation for Music Studies Scholarship- Established for students who intend to major in music and pursue a career in music after graduation from college. Scholarship amount is \$1500.

3. WJZ-TVerry Turner Broadcast Scholarship- Established for students who intend to major in and pursue a career in broadcast journalism after graduation from college. Scholarship amount is \$1500.

Deadline for any scholarship is February 15, 2010. Applications can be found in the Counseling Office or on line at www.bcf.org/scholarships.

5. **CENTRAL SCHOLARSHIP BUREAU** Grants and loans are available through this privately funded website to students from Maryland. For more details and to see what scholarships are available, visit www.centrlsb.org. **Applications will be available after January 7, 2010. Deadline is May 1, 2010**
6. **CYNTHIA E. MORGAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND** A \$1000 will be awarded to a first generation college student who will be attending a Maryland accredited school and planning on majoring in a medical-related field. For application go to www.cemsfund.com. **Deadline is February 25, 2010.**
7. **DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION SCHOLARSHIPS-** DAR has several scholarships offered for various amounts and majors in college. Amounts range from \$500 a year to \$2000. **Information in the Counseling office on several scholarships:**
- a) Pittenger and Hobbs American History Scholarship- A \$2000 scholarship for up to 4 years will be awarded to a graduating high school senior who have a concentrated study of a minimum of 24 credit hours in American History or Government while in college. **Deadline is February 15.**
 - b) C.E. Holt Nursing Scholarship- A one-time \$1000 scholarship for students who are in financial need and have been accepted or are currently enrolled in an accredited school of nursing. **Deadline is February 15.**
 - c) Lillian and Arthur Dunn Scholarship- A \$2000 award for up to four years to a well qualified, deserving sons and daughters of members of NSDAR for four years of college. **Deadline is February 15.**
 - d) Madeline Pickett Halbert Cogswell Nursing Scholarship- A one-time \$1000 scholarship who have been accepted or are currently enrolled in an accredited school of nursing, who are members of NSDAR, descendants of members of NSDAR or are eligible to be members of NSDAR. **Deadline is February 15.**
8. **DISABLED AMERICAN VET- JESSE BROWN SCHOLARSHIP-** Scholarships can be awarded to any volunteer who is age 21 or younger and has volunteered for a minimum of 100 hours at a VA medical center during the previous calendar year. For more information go to <http://www.dav.org/volunteers/Scholarship.aspx> **Deadline is February 26, 2010.**
9. **FFA SCHOLARSHIPS** Many scholarships are available for students who are current FFA Members, are seniors in high school and plan on attending a post secondary institution full time next year. Applications and specific information on individual scholarships is available on line at WWW.ffa.org. **Deadline is February 15, 2010**

- 10. GREATER CARROLL LIONS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP** This \$1000 scholarship is awarded to a well-rounded college bound student who is devoted to academics, extracurricular activities and his/her community. Scholarships applications are available in the Counseling Office. **Deadline is March 15, 2010.**
- 11. GUARANTEED SCHOLARSHIPS-** A number of colleges and universities have guaranteed scholarships for various reasons. For a list of colleges go to <http://www.guaranteed-scholarships.com/>
- 12. IMAGINE AMERICA SCHOLARSHIPS** Private Career colleges offer a limited number of scholarships to students who plan on attending a private career college after high school. Some of the local schools include Hagerstown Business College, Baltimore School of Massage, and TESST College of Technology along with many others. **For more information, see Ms. Cunningham**
- 13. JEWISH COMMUNITY SERVICES –**
- a. General – for students planning to pursue higher education and are from a Jewish Family, single parent home. Financial need, academic performance and extra-curricular are selection criteria. **Application deadline is March 31, 2010. Application can be picked up in the Counseling Office.**
 - b. The Newhoff Scholarship Fund – for learning disabled students planning to attend college, trade, or vocational school. Student may be pursuing a vocational, trade or college education. Student may be from a single or two parent Jewish family. For applications, log onto www.jbbl.org or pick on up in the Counseling Office. **Deadline: March 31, 2010.**
- 14. KIDS CHANCE OF MARYLAND-** These scholarships are awarded to students that has had a parent injured or killed on the job in the state of Maryland. Award amounts vary depending on the school of choice. Applications can be downloaded at www.kidschance-md.org.
- 15. KFC Colonel's Scholars Program-** The KFC Colonel's Scholars Program is looking for high school seniors with entrepreneurial drive, strong perseverance, demonstrated financial need, and who want to pursue a college education at an accredited public institution in the state they reside. Additional information and applications are available on line at <http://www.kfcscholars.org> between December 1, 2009 and February 10, 2010.
- 16. MARINE CORP SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION** Yearly scholarships (ranging from \$1000 to \$12,500) are awarded annually. Students who are the son or daughter of a Marine on active duty or in the Reserve, retired or deceased, is the son or daughter of a Marine or Marine Reservist who has received and Honorable Discharge, Medical Discharge or who was killed while in the service of our country, or the son or daughter of an active duty, reserve, or former US Navy Corpsman and who is serving or has served with the US Marine Corps **and** are a senior, GPA is at least a 2.0, and the family income is less than \$80,000. - 17. Martin K.P. and Kelly W. HILLS SCHOLAR PROGRAM**- Students planning on attending Carroll Community College and has SAT scores of 1100+ (math and reading), is in the top 15% of their graduating class or have a cumulative GPA of a 3.2 can apply for the Hill Scholars Program. Scholarships are awarded based on success in this program. Deadline is in December.
- 18. MARYLAND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION**- 5 \$1000 scholarships will be awarded to students pursuing a career in Emergency Management or a related field. Applications and additional information is available in the Counseling Office. **Deadline is postmarked or hand delivered by April 1, 2010.**
- 19. MARYLAND FARM BUREAU** - Ten, \$2,000 scholarships for high school seniors who are members or children or grandchildren of the Maryland Farm Bureau. Students must be planning to pursue higher education at a two or four year college. Current college students may also apply. Applications available in the counseling office. **Deadline: February 1, 2010**
- 20. Maryland Pathways Program, University of Maryland at College Park**- This program is for Maryland residents with high financial need to attend college at College Park for free. Qualifying students will receive sufficient grants funds to cover tuition, fees, room board and books. To be eligible, a student must be dependent, a Maryland Resident student and eligible fore the Auto-Zero EFC calculation. Students must also apply for the Guaranteed Access Grant in early February. For more information, see your counselor.
- 21. MASONIC CHARITIES OF MARYLAND** – One, \$1000.00 award to a graduating Carroll County senior who is planning on attending a two or four year college/university. Three seniors may be nominated to represent NCH. Academic record, financial need, community and school activities, a personal resume are some selection criteria. **Deadline: March 3, 2010 to Ms. Cunningham.**
- 22. MaxPreps Citizen Athlete Program**- The Army National Guard will award \$25,000 to high school student-athletes who are model citizens in all areas of life: community service, academics, athletics and school involvement. Anybody can nominate any 2009-2010 athlete. Go to www.MaxPreps.com/CitizenAthlete. **Entries must be submitted before March 12, 2010.**
- 23. NATIONAL CO-OP SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM** The National Commission for Cooperative Education will offer 175 merit co-op scholarships to students who plan on attending one of the following schools: CW Post Campus of Long Island University, Drexel University, Johnson & Wales University, Kettering University, Northeastern University, Pace University, Rochester Institute of Technology, University of Cincinnati, University of Toledo or Wentworth Institute of Technology. - 24. OH THE PLACES YOU'LL GO SCHOLARSHIP-** Dr. Seuss's *Oh, the Places You'll Go!* College \$5000 Scholarship recognizes a high school senior who understands and values the limitless possibilities that educations can offer with a scholarship award. **Application and criteria can be downloaded at www.ohtheplaces.org or picked up in the school counseling office. Entries must be postmarked by February 15, 2010.**
- 25. SCHOLAR ATHLETE MILK MUSTACHE AWARD** – A \$7500 scholarship is awarded to outstanding scholar athletes. Application will only be accepted online at www.sammy.bodybymilk.com until **March 5, 2010.**
- 26. SCHOLARSHIPS FOR MILITARY CHILDREN-** Dependent unmarried children under the age of 23 of active duty personnel, reserve/guard and retired military members, or survivors of service members who died may be eligible for this scholarship. A student must be looking at enrolling in a full-time undergraduate program. The applicant must have a 3.0GPA. For more information, go to <http://militaryscholar.org/apply/apply.shtml>.
- 27. THE CLAIRE AND ROBERT MOORE SCHOLARSHIP/COLLEGE OF NOTRE DAME OF MARYLAND-** A yearly \$1000 scholarship will be awarded to a student who is interested in majoring in English and/or Drama and attending the College of Notre Dame of Maryland. Information and the application form can be found at <http://crmoorscholarship.org/>. Applications are due March 15, 2010.
- 28. THE GEORGE E. SONNEFELD FOUNDATION, INC SCHOLARSHIP** Two \$2500 Scholarships will be awarded to two college bound high school seniors, who plays golf, has an established handicap and lives in the Greater Baltimore Area. **Applications are available in the Counseling Office. Deadline is March 15, 2010**
- 29. THE SOCIETY OF WOMEN ENGINEERS BALTIMORE-WASHINGTON SECTION** – Scholarship awards for young women who reside in the metropolitan Maryland/Washington, D.C. area and plan to major in engineering. Student must be a high school senior. Information about the SWE-BWS and the local scholarship program can be found in guidance or at www.swe-bws.org. You will be linked to the national scholarships for women planning on majoring in Engineering. **The deadline to apply for national freshman scholarships is March 1, 2010.**
- 30. THE PRINCETON PRIZE IN RACE RELATIONS-** \$1000 cash award for a student who is doing outstanding work in their school or community to advance the cause of race relations. Applications can be downloaded from www.princeton.edu/PrincetonPrize. **Deadline is January 31, 2010.**

31. **SAE ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIPS** – Two scholarship programs are available:

***Undesignated scholarships**—Applicant must enroll in an engineering program accredited by the Accrediting Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET) at a university of the applicant's choice. GPA and SAT/ACT scores are some selection criteria. Scholarships range from \$1,000 to \$10,000. 32. **SUNTRUST OFF TO COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP SWEEPSTAKES** – High school seniors can win a \$1,000 scholarship for their first year expenses at an accredited college or private career school. One winner will be chosen every two weeks from October through May. Students may register at www.offtocollege.info beginning September 14. Only one entry per person for each drawing, however students can register after each drawing for the next scheduled drawing.

33. **Town of Hampstead Scholarship**- Three \$1000 scholarships will be awarded to students who reside within the municipal boundaries of the Town of Hampstead. Applicants must be a North Carroll Student who has been accepted into a college or university, have a "B" average or better in high school. The applicant must have demonstrated a commitment to the community. Scholarships are based on financial need.
