## **Turnitin**

Carroll County Public Schools prepares students to understand the importance of plagiarism prevention by utilizing a web-based tool, Turnitin® developed by iParadigms. By using this tool to submit their written work, students learn about plagiarism when material from another source is identified. The tool evaluates the paper, and the student is provided with an originality report. This originality report matches the text in the student's paper to other written text from various sources: Internet, previous student submissions to Turnitin®, and databases of journal articles and periodicals. In turn, instructors assist students with crediting sources appropriately, making Turnitin® a valuable instructional tool. In addition, this tool is another means of preparing students for coursework beyond high school. Turnitin® is frequently used by colleges and universities to prevent plagiarism. To use this resource, students must enroll under their teacher's direction to submit written work. Each student receives a class ID number and a password in order to enter the Site. A student enrolls using their own email address, class ID number, and password. Students may have the teacher submit written work for them if a parent objects to their child having direct access to the program. Such requests should be submitted in writing directly to the teacher. Students may enroll independently in this program if they are eighteen (18) years of age or older.

## **PERMISSION TO PHOTOGRAPH, VIDEOTAPE OR AUDIOTAPE**

Throughout the school year, the Carroll County Public School System frequently covers school activities and may use your child's photograph, video image, or voice for educational, informational, or public relations purposes, with or without identification by name.

If you do not wish to have your child's voice reproduced on tape or to have his/her image appear in such things as a video, a photograph, or the school website, please notify the school principal in writing. It is assumed that parents and guardians consent to their children being audiotaped, photographed, videotaped, or having their image placed on a school website unless such notification is received.

There are also occasions at which the media cover certain school events (such as when a government leader visits a school). If you do not wish to have your child's name or likeness published by the media, you should address your concerns directly to the school involved so that the media is so advised. Please be advised that the school system has no control over the media when they are covering activities such as sporting events and musical programs that are open to the public.

## **COUNSELING OFFICE NEWS**

### **Financial Aid Workshops**

The school counseling office will once again present during the parent teacher conference day on Monday November 24, 2008, Lori Henry, Director of Financial Aid from Carroll Community College. Ms. Henry will present a workshop on program options (grants, scholarships, loans, etc), applications, deadlines and tips for applying for college financial aid. The same workshop will be presented at 3:00 pm and 6:30 pm in the auditorium of North Carroll High School. Each presentation will be about 60 minutes long. Additional resources will be available including information on scholarships. If you are interested in attending, please plan your teacher conferences around one of these presentations.

On January 8, a workshop on completing the FAFSA form and a question and answer session on general questions will be presented. Watch for upcoming announcements in future newsletters or through Eschoolnewsletter for specifics.

### **Scholarships**

The senior scholarship bulletin will be published each month during the first week of the month. The scholarship bulletin will be sent through Eschoolnewsletter immediately and will be put on the school website within the first few days of each month. Announcements will be made that a paper version is available in the School Counseling Office. Many local scholarships are announced through this bulletin. Applications, if available, will in the scholarship box in the School Counseling Office. Please encourage your seniors to review the available scholarships and to apply by the date listed.

The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) had been administered to 10<sup>th</sup> grade students, as well as, 9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students who elected to take the test on October 15, 2008 at North Carroll High School. A meeting to explain the results will be held at NCHS on Thursday, December 11, 2008 at 7:00pm with a snow date of Thursday, December 18, 2008 at 7:00pm. Because the test results do not arrive at NCH until just prior to the meeting, they cannot be shared before December 11<sup>th</sup>. # PLACEMENT, PROMOTION, INTERVENTION, AND RETENTION

## I. PURPOSE

To establish a uniform, county-wide policy which recognizes the profound effect placement, promotion, intervention, and retention decisions have upon students.

To provide a framework for increasing individual student academic success through early, research-based, well-planned, and documented intervention in order to minimize retention and to eliminate social promotion.

To provide a process that is consistent across all schools and supports the Board of Education's commitment to the success of all students.

## II. DEFINITIONS

None

## III. POLICY STATEMENT

The Board of Education endorses and encourages the belief that all students can learn, progress, and achieve when individual differences are recognized and addressed through effective instruction and intervention. The final responsibility for decisions on placement, promotion, intervention, and retention of a student rests with the principal. The decision-making process includes parents/guardians and CCPS staff. Students are also included when appropriate. Funding which supports this policy shall be included in the CCPS operating budget.

## IV. EXCEPTIONS

Exceptions to this policy occur when decisions are made through the Individual Education Program process for students documented as qualifying for special education.

## V. GUIDELINES

The following rules guide the decision-making on placement and promotion, intervention, and retention:

### A. Placement and Promotion

1. In kindergarten through grade eight, placement and promotion will be based on academic progress and attainment of grade level promotion standards in reading and mathematics that are directly linked to Maryland Content Standards.

2. In kindergarten through grade eight, the decision-making process includes parents/guardians and school staff. Students are included when appropriate. The final responsibility for decisions on placement and promotion of a student rests with the principal except for students with documented special education needs where decisions are made through the Individual Education Program process.

3. In grades nine through twelve, placement and promotion of students will be based on the number of credits earned as follows:

9th to 10th grade - completion of a minimum of 6 credits

10th to 11th grade - completion of a minimum of 12 credits

11th to 12th grade - completion of a minimum of 18 credits

### B. Intervention

When a student in kindergarten through grade twelve is not attaining assigned objectives or meeting required grade level promotion standards, research-based intervention programs and services will be provided to address the specific academic needs of the individual student.

A consistent model will be used throughout the county for the student support team, for the process used to identify students who are in need of additional services, and for monitoring student progress.

### C. Retention

1. In kindergarten through grade eight, retention will be used only when planned intervention efforts to assist the student in meeting grade level promotion standards have been unsuccessful.

2. In grades nine through twelve, retention will be based on the number of credits that the student has earned as stated in section V.A.3 of this policy.

3. In kindergarten through grade twelve, the final responsibility for decisions on retention of a student rests with the principal except when decisions are made through the Individual Education Program process for students with documented special education needs.

## VI. REPORTS

The principal or his designee shall submit the proposed plan of study for each retained student to the Assistant Superintendent of Instruction by October 1 in the year in which the student is retained.

The principal or his designee will monitor and maintain a record of instructional interventions provided for students who have been retained.

A report on retentions will be sent to the Board of Education annually.

## VII. EXPIRATION/REVIEW

This policy will be reviewed at the end of three years, or sooner.

## VIII. DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

The superintendent/designee has the responsibility for enforcing this policy by communicating it to all relevant parties and by providing necessary instructions and/or administrative regulations (if appropriate), to all staff members.
