Dear Runnymede Families:

The new year has been busy here at Runnymede Elementary School! Teachers have been working with students on Reading and Math Assessments. These county assessments tell how well our students have met the expectations of the CCPS curriculum. If you would like more information about how your child performed on these local assessments, first check your child's report card, then talk with the appropriate teacher or call the office.

What To Do If You Have Concerns About Your Child's Progress:

1. Discuss your concerns with your child's teacher. Teachers have many options, including asking for assistance from the school's IST (Instructional Support Team.) This team helps the teacher to assess the instructional needs of children who may need a different instructional approach or strategy to meet with success.
2. Gather specific data (assignments, tests, homework, etc.) to show why you have the concern. Be aware of or ask for interventions to be used to assist your child. Allow sufficient time for the intervention(s) to be effective. This generally takes 6-8 weeks. Then monitor the effects of the interventions with your child's teacher. If you are still concerned, contact us and request a meeting to discuss your child's progress. At this meeting we will determine what steps the school needs to take to ensure successful intervention for your child.

It is with great pleasure that we congratulate the following Runnymede teachers who have been nominated as Outstanding Teacher of the Year: Andrea Warnick, Leah Offutt, Nicole Hunsicker, Sarah Horner, Laura Fagioli, Kelly Dummann, and Lori Douglas. Congratulations! Although we feel all teachers deserve a special thank you for their hard work, we are pleased and proud that over the years, so many of our teachers have been honored with this nomination.

Parents can help their children be successful not only on tests but daily in school by:

- ❖ Making sure they are in school every day and on time.
- ❖ Encouraging them to listen carefully to directions and to try even when something seems difficult.
- ❖ Making sure they get a good night's sleep and a nourishing breakfast.

We request that families of students involved in testing avoid planning doctor/dental appointments, vacations, etc. during these times. With the exception of illness, all students should be present for all components of the testing.

MSA Information-Math

What is a BCR?

"BCR" is the abbreviation for a Brief Constructed Response. A BCR in mathematics has two parts. In Part A, the students are provided with a problem to solve. They must choose a strategy to use to solve the problem, solve it in the space provided, and record the answer. In Part B, students have to write about HOW they solved the problem (Grades K-2) or about WHY their answer is correct (Grades 2-5).

How is Part A scored?

Students receive 1 point if the answer in Part A is completely correct or 0 points if the answer is incorrect.

How is Part B scored?

In Part B, students receive 2, 1, or 0 points depending on their written response. To receive 2 points, the response shows a complete understanding and analysis of the problem. For 1 point, the response demonstrates a minimal understanding and analysis of the problem. To receive a score of "0", the response is completely incorrect or irrelevant to the problem or missing. Work shown in Part A can be used to support what is written in Part B. It is important that students show all of their work and include appropriate labels related to the problem itself.

What is the difference between "complete" and "minimal" understanding of the problem?

The CCPS/MSA Mathematics BCR Scoring Tool is used to determine the difference. It contains specific language that teachers can use to determine the difference. Teachers have collaborated at the school and system level to develop a clear understanding of these expectations. Before grading a BCR, each teacher develops possible responses that would fit the criteria of a score of "2". Those ideas are used as a guide to differentiate between a score of 2, 1, or 0.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Countywide Kindergarten Registration will be held **March 26th-30th** from **10:00-3:00** daily and **Wednesday, March 28th from 5pm-7pm**. All incoming students need to be 5 years old on or before **September 1, 2012**. All students must be registered at their home school.

Please provide the following documentation and information at the time of registration:

- ⇒ **Parent photo I.D.**
- ⇒ **Verification of birth:**
a birth certificate, hospital certificate, baptismal certificate, birth registration notice or a passport/visa.
- ⇒ **Verification of Residency:**
 - a **recent** (within 60 days) -mortgage statement, utility bill (electric, land-line phone, cable, oil, water), rent receipt
 - a signed settlement document
 - a current signed rental/lease agreement
 - a property tax bill from the current fiscal year indicating "Primary Residence"
 - a deed-showing house number, street name and the name of the parent/legal guardian
 - a signed contract on home being built with approved non-resident or out-of-district status.
 - If you live in a home owned or rented by someone else, you must provide proof of residency of the owner and complete a Residency Verification Statement.
- ⇒ **Transportation Information:** Specific address from which the child will be transported to school and the specific address to which the child will be transported to after school.

If you have any questions, please contact your home school.

Carry ID, Please

Visitors and volunteers are always welcome at Runnymede! Whenever you come into the office to pick up your child early from school, please remember to carry your ID with you. Sometimes we don't quite remember everyone's faces, and you might be asked to produce identification. Please don't be offended. We just want to be sure that your child is safe.

Important Reminders for Parent Drop Off

For the safety of our students, parents that have decided to park at the side of the building (the lot closest to the parent drop off area), please be sure to walk your child(ren) across the drive using the crosswalk. Buses and cars come and go along the drive and for everyone's safety, all children must be accompanied on the crosswalk.

For the safety of our students and families using the larger parking lot, all children must be accompanied to and from the school using the crosswalk at the front of the building. At arrival and dismissal, adults and children must use the crosswalk to safely move across the drive.

For parents dropping off students in the car rider line, please pull your car up to the farthest end of the curb. This will allow as many as six cars to unload at the same time. In an effort to keep the line moving, parents are asked to remain in their vehicles and allow children to get out of the cars independently using the door on the curb side of the vehicle.

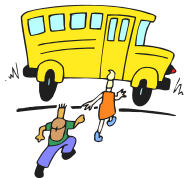
Check for Traffic

The school bus is the safest of all forms of transportation. The design of a school bus affords the children on board more protection than any vehicle on the road. The school bus driver is a highly trained professional whose primary concern is the safety of the precious cargo on board the bus. The additional safety equipment on the outside of the bus (the crossing arm, the stop arms, the flashing yellow and

red lights, and the strobe light,) serves to notify the motoring public a school bus is in the process of loading or unloading students. Even with the safety equipment on the outside of the bus, students loading or unloading the bus are more susceptible to injury by inattentive motorists, than they are while actually riding the bus. Reinforcing school bus safety rules with children can significantly reduce the potential for injury during the loading and unloading process.

Parents, to reduce the potential for injury to your children while waiting at the bus stop and getting on or off of the bus, please reinforce the following rules.

- ❖ Arrive at the bus stop at least five minutes prior to the scheduled pickup time.
- ❖ Wait at the bus stop in an orderly manner a safe distance away from traffic.
- ❖ Line up in an orderly manner; do not push or shove another student. Students should be waiting and ready to board the bus when the bus arrives.
- ❖ When the bus has arrived and has come to a complete stop with the red school lights flashing, students should look **Left, Right, and Left again** to ensure that all traffic has stopped, prior to crossing the roadway in front of the bus.
- ❖ Once on board the bus, students should promptly sit in their assigned seats.

As February approaches, the weather continues to be variable. Please be sure that your child is dressed according to the weather each day and is wearing an appropriate coat and shoes. Children with colds may bring non-medicated cough drops, ChapStick and/or hand lotion to school to use during the day, if needed.

A number of parents have needed to be called to provide additional clothing for their child who had torn

clothing, large food/drink spills or bathroom accidents. **Please send a weather appropriate change of clothing for your child to keep in his/her locker** so we will not have to call you at work. Even older children occasionally have the need to change their clothing, and the clothing supply at school is minimal and will not accommodate an older / larger child.

*** If you have any gently used sweatpants that your child no longer needs, please consider donating them to the health room. Thank you. ***

Children with fevers of 100 degrees or more, or with wheezing, vomiting or diarrhea will need to remain at home and may need to be seen by a doctor. Follow your doctor's advice regarding when the child may return to school. **If your child will need medication during the school day, please remember that medications may NOT be transported to and from school by students. Please bring the medication to school in the original container and with a Carroll County School Medication Form filled out by their doctor. Medication in baggies will not be accepted!** If you have concerns about your child, please call me.

Student Attendance

Students enrolled in Carroll County Public Schools are expected to attend school regularly and to be punctual in their attendance. The relationship between good attendance and academic achievement is well recognized. In addition, regular school attendance assists in the development of good work habits and self-discipline.

While we realize that children are sometimes ill, it is important to be at school every day possible to participate in valuable class discussions. Unless your child has a fever, rash, or stomach ailment, please encourage your child to come to school. More often than not, once the child is in school, he/she is fine.

Family vacations during school days are strongly discouraged due to the impact they may have on school performance and grades earned. Both students and parents need to understand that some loss of learning opportunity is likely. For example, some school work such as class participation/discussion of science experiments simply are difficult, if not impossible, to make up and therefore may have a negative impact upon a student's grade. Parents of students already having excessive absences and poor grades need to understand the implications of any extended absences.

The relationship between good school attendance and academic achievement is well recognized. Regular school attendance assists in the development of good work habits and self-discipline.

Absence Notes

Be sure to send in notes for your child's absence in a timely manner. If we do not receive a note within 5 days the absence becomes an unlawful absence and will remain that way until we receive verification of the reason for the absence. Also, all requests for absences due to travel or vacation must be sent in to the principal for approval prior to the absence. Attendance is closely tied to academic performance so please have your children in attendance each and every day possible.

Vacation Absences



It is strongly recommended that parents plan vacation(s) for times when school is not in regular session. It is recognized, however, that occasionally students are absent for necessary or important family activities. When this occurs, it is the parents' responsibility to contact the principal in writing in advance to arrange an excused absence. Even though the absence may be excused, students are required to make up work missed during that time. It is also required that you send in a note following the absence. Please list the date of the absence, the child's name, and the reason for the absence to the child's teacher.

LAWFUL ABSENCES INCLUDE:

1. **Death in the family** - The immediate family shall include parent, siblings, grandparents, a person who is the primary care provider or anyone who lives regularly in the home. The principal will determine if the absence is lawful on a case-by-case basis.
2. **Illness of the student** - The principal shall require a physician's certificate from the parent/guardian of a student who is reported continuously absent for illness more than 3 days.
3. **Violent Storms**- Violent storms shall be interpreted to mean only those weather conditions which would endanger the health, and safety of the student when in transit to or from school. Students are expected to attend school whenever school is in session, including late-arrival days.
4. **Work or activity approved** or sponsored by the school, the local school system or the State Department of Education, accepted by the local superintendent of schools or the school principal, or his designees as reason for excusing the students.
5. **State of Emergency**
6. **Other Emergency or set of circumstances** which in the judgment of the superintendent or designee (principal) constitutes a good and sufficient cause for

absence from school. This includes family vacations only when a letter is submitted to the school principal for approval prior to the vacation. Family vacations during the school days are strongly discouraged due to the impact they may have on school performance and grades earned.

7. Suspension

8. Lack of authorized transportation - This shall not include students denied authorized transportation for disciplinary reasons.

An absence for any reason other than those cited as lawful is presumed to be unlawful. Absences are also unlawful if a written note is not received upon returning to school. Unlawful absences may require a school conference.

National School Breakfast Week

Parents do you ever have one of those mornings where from the minute you roll out of bed and get the kids up, that the morning ends up somewhere between chaos and mayhem. Or maybe the breakfast cupboard is getting empty! Don't despair; send the kids in for us to

feed! We offer breakfast every day except 2 hour delay days!

We would like to encourage you to allow your child to join us in celebrating "National School Breakfast Week on March 5th through the 9th. That week we will highlight all of our breakfast food items, please check the March menu for some of our daily selections. Breakfast is served from 8:55am to 9:15am. The cost for Breakfast is \$1.25, all students on the free program can receive a free breakfast daily, and reduced breakfast is .30¢.

So always start your child's day off right with a nutritious breakfast whether you feed your kids at home or send them to us.

Hard Economic Times

Parents: Has your financial picture changed since the beginning of school? Did you know that you can apply for Free and Reduced meals at any time during the school year? And once approved your child will remain on the list until Mid October of this year at which time you will need to reapply. Applications are always available in the school office, and are handled discreetly to protect your privacy.

Save Money: Eat School Lunch

Did you know that on average it costs less to buy a school lunch than to bring a lunch from home? The estimated national average of a school lunch from home was \$3.43 last school year, compared to this year's lunch price for Elementary schools of \$2.00 here in Carroll County.

Important information for Parents Pre paying for Meals

As a convenience to our Parents, please remember that you may purchase meals direct from the Cafeteria either daily or in advance. Advance meal purchases are most helpful to avoid the lost and forgotten money, and they help to speed up our lunch lines too! We accept cash or personal checks. For advance meals please make the check amount for an exact number of meals you wish to purchase, as it is sometimes difficult to return change to the students, (example: 20 meals x \$2.00 = \$40.00). Advanced Meals may be purchased in increments of 5 but no more than 20 at a time per child. Parents, it's important to remember and understand that when you send money into the cafeteria that you are actually purchasing meals and not sending money into an account, for the student to use as needed. Please indicate on your check or in a note, if you are purchasing advance Breakfast or

Lunches, due to the difference in price. Reduced meals may be purchased in advance as well. Meals once purchased are **non-refundable** and cannot be switched to a different type of meal (example: Lunch credits cannot be used for Breakfast or snack).
