## UPDATE:

During the month of November, counselors worked with students to update their educational career plans. Mrs. Held provided S.A.T. preparation sessions for students. Many colleges visited Winters Mill to meet with our students. Report cards were prepared and distributed. Internship seminars were held by our career coordinator. A financial aid presentation was given during conference night for parents. Counselors presented information to eighth graders during the 8th grade transition day. The ASVAB results came in and counselors held a session for students to interpret their scores. During the month of December, counselors continued to work on students' educational career plans, distributed and interpreted PSAT results, and sent letters out to seniors in danger of failing classes. The month of January will be a busy month. High School Assessments will be administered, Semester 1 will end, and Semester 2 will get under way. Seniors who applied to colleges early will start receiving college acceptance letters. The course selection process will begin, and preparations for the Class of 2012 graduation will begin. # ACADEMY SPOTLIGHT



## Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics **STEM ACADEMY**

Students at Winters Mill High School will be engaged in a rigorous academic curriculum with a career theme. This approach will enable them to see the link between what they learn in school and how their learning applies to the workplace and further education. To accomplish this in a smaller learning environment, four career academy programs have been established to provide a more focused program of study for each of our students.

Academy program activities include exploring career interests, incorporating cutting-edge technology, and participating in internships and partnerships with local businesses. The curriculum at Winters Mill High School is based around four broad career academies which include: (1) HEALTH, HUMAN, AND SOCIAL SCIENCES; (2) ARTS, HUMANITIES, AND COMMUNICATIONS; (3) SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, AND MATH; & (4) BUSINESS AND INFORMATION MANAGEMENT.

Each of the next four months we will be spotlighting one of these Academy's in preparation for our Academy Fair to be held in the spring. This month's "Spotlight" is on the Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics ACADEMY or STEM Academy for short. The STEM Academy is geared towards students with interests in these types of careers; Animal and Veterinary Science, Landscaping Design and Construction, Auto Service Technology, Masonry, Engineering Technology, and Biomedical Science. Two students here are working on internships in (1) Veterinary Science and (2) Biomedical Science. First, Meghan Delp, Veterinary Science, is working with Dr. M. Tanner, DVM. During her time she works as a Vet Assistant; helping with x-rays, Inventory, administering Medications, and clerical duties associated with a Veterinarian Clinic. The second is Aastha Kaul, in Biomedical Science, is working with the National Cancer Institute. She is working with the institute to try and find and isolate cancer cells and treat specific forms of cancer related to transplants. She works daily conducting experiments and research and analyzing the data collected from each.

As you can see we are very busy here at Winters Mill High school and these are only 2 examples of what our students are doing. Please plan to join us May 17<sup>th</sup>, 2012 here at Winters Mill High School to see what all our Academy Interns are doing, or have been doing over this entire school year. Be on the lookout for next month's Academy Spotlight, ARTS, HUMANITIES, AND COMMUNICATIONS or AHC Academy.

## Anniversary of Winters Mill High School - 10 Years!



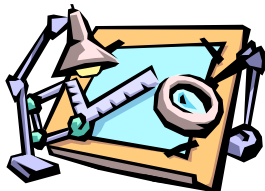
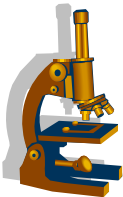

Making a career plan is part of a process that involves understanding self, exploring and researching various careers. With the changing economy, students should plan for and have an education plan. Students, advisors, parents and counselors need to assess students' interest areas, and encourage students to take as many courses from those cluster areas that will provide concentrated skills that can be applied to employment or/and furthering their education. The **career majors and completers that are available are in the Program of Studies**. They are the basis of the career plan. Students should be bringing the Program of Studies booklet home in January. Parents and students can re-assess their interests by taking the BRIDGES CLUSTER ASSESSMENT under the School Counseling section of the website under Career Connections- Career Exploration. Students should re-assess themselves each academic year to determine how their personality has developed through experiences in or outside of school.

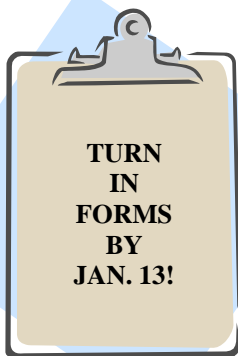


Counseling Needs 10 days to process your transcript requests!

## This information is from Carroll Community College...

### Placement Testing

High School juniors considering Concurrent Enrollment during their senior year and seniors planning to attend Carroll once they graduate, should plan to take the college placement tests between the months of November and January. This will allow students to receive their results and schedule their high school senior classes appropriately or schedule their college courses early. Registration for fall at Carroll begins April 19<sup>th</sup> and this is the best opportunity to register for both the class and time slot that they want.

We have scheduled special high school testing dates at the College. They are scheduled days off (or ½ days) for your students. As always, if students are not available to test during these dates, they can arrange for another time at the College. **Students are required to contact** the Admissions Office at 410.386.8430 to schedule their testing time slot. We will be unable to accommodate anyone that does not have an appointment. **Test dates and times** are listed below and attached is a flyer you can use for distribution:

## C.C.C.T.C. Common Questions:

**Question:** When do the Academy of Health Professional students find out what they got accepted to?

**Answer:** The deadline is Feb 1st for the 2013/2014 school year and students will find out in mid-Feb. We do this to avoid confusion with the 2012/2013 programs.

**Question:** Can I still apply to the Career and Tech Center since I missed the Dec. 1st deadline!

**Answer:** Absolutely! Some of the programs will be full but you can apply anytime between now and two weeks before the program starts next January 2013 (for most programs).

**Question:** What is Cisco? What do they study, specifically, in Video Production?

**Answer:** Go to [www.carrollk12.org/ctc/programs](http://www.carrollk12.org/ctc/programs) and click on competencies to see the skills you will learn in the class.

**Question:** My dad said that if I plan to go to college I should not go to the Vo-Tech center. What should I tell him? (an oldie but a goodie)

## College News College Acceptance-



### Key Factors for College Acceptance:

According to the 2011 State of College Admission report from the National Association for College Admission Counseling, the most important factors used by admissions officers to evaluate college applicants were:

1. Grades in college prep classes
2. Strength in curriculum
3. Scores from standardized admissions tests
4. Overall GPA
5. Strength of the application essay or writing sample
6. Student's level of interest in attending
7. Class rank
8. Counselor and teacher recommendations
9. Extracurricular activities

Factors that were rated lowest by college admissions officials include SAT II scores, state graduation exam scores, portfolios, and work experience.



## College News NCAA

### Interesting Facts:

The NCAA oversees 89 championships in 23 sports. There are more than 400,000 student-athletes competing in three divisions at over 1,000 colleges and universities within the NCAA.



### NCAA Raises Academic Standards for Incoming Freshmen

Beginning in August 2015, high school student athletes will need a 2.3 GPA to gain immediate access to competition their freshman year of college. This rose from the current 2.0 requirement. A more-rigorous sliding scale will also toughen entrance standards for all new athletes. Some flexibility will remain, however, for students entering college with a 2.0 GPA. They will be allowed to keep their athletic scholarships during their freshman year, but they will be ineligible to play. During this "academic redshirt" year, they can practice with their teams in the first term, and if they pass nine semester hours or eight quarter hours, they'll be eligible to practice in the second term. Also under the new rules, high school student athletes will have to complete and pass 10 of 16 required core classes before the start of their senior year in high school. Seven of those 10 courses must be in English, math, and science.

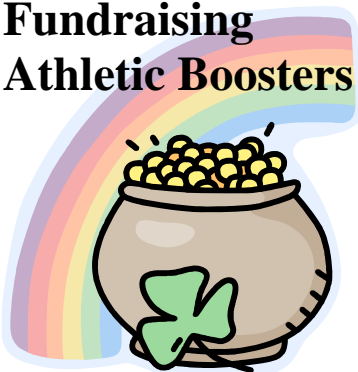

## **CARROLL COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS OUT-OF-DISTRICT REQUESTS FOR THE 2012 - 2013 SCHOOL YEAR**

Board policy states that students who attend Carroll County Public Schools shall attend school in their designated attendance area. However, in very specific and limited circumstances, students may be placed in a school outside their attendance area if an approvable circumstance is deemed to exist.

Parents/legal guardians desiring an out-of-district placement for their child should carefully review the list of approvable circumstances listed on the back of the out-of-district application to determine whether the child meets the criteria for approval. Please review the out-of-district regulations in the Student Services manual for updates. The information can be found in Section I of the Student Services manual at [www.carrollk12.org](http://www.carrollk12.org). The Carroll County Public Schools' out-of-district policy and regulation will be strictly adhered to in making decisions regarding admission of students to schools outside of their assigned attendance area.

It is the parent's/legal guardian's responsibility to obtain an out-of-district application from the school office or the Student Services Department. These applications will be available on December 5, 2011. Completed out-of-district applications may not be returned to the school office.

The deadline for out-of-district applications for the 2012-2013 school year is **February 1, 2012**. Completed applications must be **postmarked or personally delivered** by the deadline date to:

## *What Is Scrip?*

Scrip is a term that means “substitute money”. When you purchase scrip, you’re purchasing negotiable gift certificates and prepaid cards that are used just like cash. You can use scrip to purchase everyday expenses like food, clothing, and other essentials, and with every purchase, you earn revenue for our organization.

## *How scrip generates revenue for you*

The Great Lakes Scrip Center acts on behalf of churches, schools and other non-profit organizations to purchase large amounts of scrip from grocery stores, department stores, and other retailers. Because the scrip is purchased with cash up front, the participating retailers offer a substantial discount. Our organization buys the scrip from Great Lakes Scrip Center at a discount, and re-sells the certificates to families like yours for full face value. The discount - from two to fifteen percent or more – is our organization’s revenue.

## **Scrip is "shopping cart fundraising"**

Scrip is a popular fundraiser because families don't have to sell anything. Organization members produce revenue by making regular household purchases they would make anyway. Groceries, clothing, toys, gifts, even gasoline can be purchased with scrip.
