RESIDENCE ADDRESS CHANGES

Very often students' addresses change during the course of the school year, and parents/guardians are unaware of the procedures necessary to change their child(ren)'s records. Be advised that all address changes must be documented by an appropriate proof of residence as mandated by state guidelines. Acceptable documents for proof of residence include:

- A signed contract on a home being built in Carroll County for families with approved non-resident or out-of-district status. MUST be followed by another acceptable proof of residence once the family moves into the county or district
- A signed rental/lease agreement on a home/apartment in which you are residing
- A current rent receipt *
- Recent bill of service delivered to the residence (i.e., BGE, land-line phone, cable, oil, water *)
- Recent mortgage statement/bill noting primary residence
- A SIGNED settlement document *
- A property tax bill from the current fiscal year indicating "Primary Residence"
- A notarized Residence Verification Statement accompanied by an acceptable proof of residence for the owner/lease of the property
- Deed (must show house number and street name) *
- Other (Pupil Personnel Worker Approved)

*** DATE OF DOCUMENT MUST BE WITHIN 60 DAYS OF ENROLLMENT**

Once said document is received, the student's records are updated.

Each fall, sophomores and juniors have the opportunity to take the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT). This year, it will be administered in each county high school on Wednesday, October 15, 2008 during regular school hours. Students often ask, "Why should I take the PSAT?" For juniors, the best reason for taking the PSAT is that the participant automatically becomes eligible for the National Merit Scholarship Program that can yield monetary reward. Students may only qualify for the National Merit program in their junior year.

For sophomores, the major advantages of taking the PSAT are to become acquainted with a test that is similar in length and structure to the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT). Also, by testing against a national group, sophomores can more accurately assess their educational strengths and weaknesses, resulting in an increased awareness of academic areas in need of attention.

Developers of the SAT have indicated that one of the best ways to improve scores is to take the SAT or tests like the PSAT again and again, providing practice and an opportunity to reduce test anxiety.

Carroll County Public Schools will pay for all sophomores in a Carroll County high school to take the PSAT. Prior to the test, students will be presented a special advisory lesson to assist in their understanding of the structure and scope of the PSAT. When scores are received, each school will offer an interpretation session for parents and their students. These sessions should assist them in understanding how to use these scores to increase academic performance in the future.

Each school will also receive a report called "AP Potential." It identifies students that, based on their PSAT performance, have the potential to take and do well in Advanced Placement (AP) courses. This information will also be shared with parents and students.

Sophomores may opt out of the PSAT if a written request is made by a parent. Please be aware that the county will not pay for juniors to take the test, even if they did not take it in their sophomore year.

All sophomores and juniors who are considering any form of post-secondary education, such as a four-year college, community college, trade or technical school, or the military are encouraged to

take the PSAT. Please contact your guidance counselor if you have any questions. (Please see the flyer on the next page for more information on the PSAT.)

High School Assessment Help

Starting with the class of 2009, all students must pass the high school assessments to graduate. The Maryland State Department of Education has created free, online courses that you can use to help your child on the high school assessments. You can use the courses to help your child learn assessment tested material and practice answering questions similar to those on the high school assessments. Go to <http://msde.mdk12online.org>. New Sat Score Reporting Policy

Designed to relieve student stress and improve the test-day experience, this new SAT[®] score-reporting feature provides students the opportunity to select which scores they send to colleges by test date for the SAT and by individual test for SAT Subject Tests[™]. Students can send any or all scores to a college on a single report. It will not cost more to send one, multiple or all test scores, and students can easily sign up through the Web.

The new score-reporting feature will launch in Spring 2009 for all students. Starting with the class of 2010, this feature will help lessen the anxiety associated with testing, and allow students to put their best foot forward on test day.

Scholarships and Programs

Carroll Post 31: American Legion Scholarship

Carroll Post 31 of the American Legion is offering a scholarship in the amount of \$2000 payable over two years for a 2009 graduate of both Westminster and Winters Mill High Schools. Requirements: high school transcript, two letters of recommendation, an original essay, a list of extracurricular activities, and a letter of college acceptance. Applications are available in guidance and must be submitted by **April 30, 2009**.

Gates Millennium Scholars

The Gates Millennium Scholarship Program will select one thousand students to be the recipient of this scholarship. The scholarship supports the costs of attendance and can be renewed each year throughout the student's undergraduate career and onto graduate school. To be eligible for this scholarship, students must be African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian Pacific Islander American or of Hispanic American descent, be a US citizen, have a GPA of 3.3, enrolled for the first-time at a US Accredited college or university as a full time student, and meet the Federal Pell Grant eligibility criteria. Application materials are available in guidance and also at www.gmsp.org. Paper applications must be postmarked by **January 12, 2009**. Website submissions must be complete by **January 12, 2009 at 11:59 PM**. Additional details are available in guidance.

Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps (NROTC) Scholarship

Applications are now being accepted for the Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps (NROTC) Scholarship for those graduating in 2009. Students selected for the program are awarded scholarships through a highly competitive national selection process, and receive full tuition and other financial benefits at over 150 of the country's leading colleges and universities. GENERAL SCHOOL INFORMATION

IMPORTANT

Parents and Guardians,

This is just a quick reminder that as you do your back to school shopping, you should consider the size of the backpack/carry-all you purchase for your child. For reasons dealing with school safety, congestion, and space in classrooms, Winters Mill High



School does not allow backpacks/carry-alls to be used during the school day. Students will have ample time to go to their lockers between classes to get the items they need for their next class.

Purses are permitted to be carried by students; however, these purses should only be big enough to hold eye glasses, pens/pencils, and personal items. As a rule of thumb, if a small textbook can fit in the purse, the purse will be too large to be used during the school day. Medium/large Vera Bradley purses/carry-alls/backpacks or any other type of large/medium purse/carry-all/back-pack will not be permitted to be carried during the school day.

We ask that you talk to your child regarding this rule. Students carrying large/medium size purses/carry-alls/backpacks will be asked to place the purse/carry-all/backpack in their locker until the end of school day. Repeat violations of the rule will be referred to school administration.

We thank you for your support as we strive to maintain a safe and orderly environment at Winters Mill High School.

AHERA

(Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act)

The Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) management plans for all buildings owned or leased by the Board of Education for Carroll County are available for review at the individual Carroll County school locations and at the Office of Plant Operations, located at 191 Schaeffer Avenue, Westminster, Maryland 21157.

Management plans are required by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and depict the location, amount, condition, and response action projected for any asbestos containing materials, if any are located in the school building.

Public Notification of Career and Technology Education Offerings

Carroll County Public Schools offers career and technology education programs in business, agriscience, marketing, allied health, trade, industrial and technical education, family and consumer sciences, and technology education. Business, marketing, agriscience, family and consumer science and technology education programs may be offered in each of the county's seven high schools. Trade and industry and technical programs are offered at the Carroll County Career and Technology Center and South Carroll High School. An allied health program is available at the Carroll County Career and Technology Center. These programs are open to students who are in the grade levels served by the programs and who are interested in and qualify for these educational program options.

At the Carroll County Career and Technology Center and at the Career and Technology Center at South Carroll High School, students receive specialized career training and education, as well as earning credits toward high school graduation. Students may enroll in grades 11 and/or 12 in the centers' competency-based programs, provided they meet prerequisites for specific courses. Students enrolled in the programs at the centers are also enrolled concurrently in their home schools in order to complete graduation requirements and participate in extracurricular activities. School bus transportation is provided for the students from the home schools to and from the centers. A support service team is available to work with those disadvantaged and handicapped students who need additional assistance in order to be successful in their career and technology education program. For details about programs, contact the guidance office at each high school.

Carroll County Public Schools provides career and technology education opportunities without regard to sex, race, color, religious belief, national origin, or disabilities. Scheduled Volunteer Training Sessions for 2008-2009

Level II Volunteers (classroom helpers, tutors, chaperones, mentors, etc) are required to attend an annual training session at least seven (7) school days prior to volunteering. School Days are defined as days when schools are open for students. Allow adequate time so you can arrive at the training location in a timely manner. The training session will begin promptly at the scheduled time, and those arriving after the starting time may be asked to attend another session.
