The U.S. Department of Education has launched www.college.gov, a new website aimed at motivating students with inspirational stories and information about planning, preparing, and paying for college. It is designed with students' input and participation.

ASVAB Test

Winters Mill High School's guidance department has scheduled the ASVAB test for Dec. 3 starting at 7:50 am. If interested, please sign up in the guidance office during the month of November.

The ASVAB Career Exploration Program is a comprehensive career exploration and planning program that includes a multiple aptitude test battery, an interest inventory, and various career planning tools designed to help students explore the world of work.

The ASVAB Career Exploration Program is intended for use with students in the 10th, 11th, and 12th grades, as well as students in post-secondary schools. The program provides tools, including the test battery and interest inventory, developed by the Department of Defense to help high school and post-secondary students across the nation learn more about career exploration and planning. Results of the aptitude test and the interest inventory enable students to evaluate their skills, estimate performance in academic and vocational endeavors, and identify potentially satisfying careers. These results are integrated with work values to help students identify and prioritize possible career choices. Students are encouraged to consider their own work-related values and other important personal preferences as they explore the world of work and learn career exploration skills that will benefit them throughout their work lives.

Career Speaker Day

On December 2, 2008, Winters Mill will host the 7th annual Career Speaker Day. Sixty-five representatives from business and community organizations will speak to Winters Mill High School students about their careers. Students will have an opportunity to listen to three different speakers in sessions that last twenty minutes. Students will be signing up for their Career Speaker Day choices in Advisory.

Ways to Reduce College Costs

1. Most colleges and universities offer merit or non-need-based scholarships to academically talented students. Students should check with each school in which they're interested for the criteria for merit scholarships.
2. The National Merit Scholarship Program awards scholarships to students based upon academic merit. The awards can be applied to any college or university to meet educational expenses at that school.
3. Many states offer scholarship assistance to academically talented students. Students should obtain the eligibility criteria from their state's education office.
4. Many schools offer scholarships to athletically talented students. Parents and students should be careful, however, to weigh the benefits of an athletic scholarship against the demands of this type of award.
5. Some colleges and universities offer special grants or scholarships to students with particular talents. Music, journalism, and drama are a few categories for which these awards are made.
6. A state college or university charges lower fees to state residents. Since public institutions are subsidized by state revenues, their tuition costs are lower than private schools' costs. The college selection process should include consideration of a state school. Although cost should be a consideration, students should not base their choice of a school only on cost.
7. Some students choose to attend a community college for 1 or 2 years and then transfer to a 4-year school. Tuition costs are substantially lower at community colleges than at 4-year institutions.
8. Some parents may be financially able to purchase a house while their child is in school. If other students rent rooms in the house, the income may offset monthly mortgage payments. Families should make certain, however, that the property they purchase meets all of the requirements of rental property. If you have any questions, consult a tax professional.
9. Commuting is another way for students to reduce college costs. A student living at home can save as much as \$6,000 per year.
10. Many schools provide lists of housing opportunities that provide free room and board to students in exchange for a certain number of hours of work each week.

Scholarship and Award Opportunities

New For Seniors:

Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation Scholarships

Since the program's inception in 1986, the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation has awarded more than 4,000 exceptional high school students \$35 million in scholarships to attend college. Scholars are selected based upon academic achievement, their capacity to lead, and their hours of dedicated community service. NEW WORK PERMIT PROCEDURES

The Division of Labor and Industry are transitioning to an automated work permit System.

As of December 31, 2008, the manual system of applying for a work permit will cease to function. The automated work permit and application system is available online at: www.dlir.state.md.us. After accessing this web site, choose Minor Work Permits. You will see these instructions:

***If you want to get a job in Maryland
and you are a minor 14 to 17 years old
you need a Minor Work Permit***

Here's how to get one...

1. Print a hard copy Work Permit Application - (**Word** document, 33KB, [download Word viewer for free](#)) or Adobe Acrobat format (**PDF** document, 84KB, [download Adobe Acrobat for free](#)). Click on the underlined link (**Word**) or (**PDF**) for the form to come up.
2. Complete the "To the Minor" section.
3. Have your employer complete and sign the "To the Employer" section.
4. Have your parent or guardian sign and date our application after they review it.
5. Fill out the [Online Application](#) completely using the data collected on the hard copy application. www.dlir.state.md.us/labor/empm.shtml
6. For Proof of Age - You may use:
Birth Certificate
School Records
Valid Maryland Driver's License
Any official Government document
7. Follow Directions on the Application Receipt.
8. Take this Application, the online Application Receipt and your Proof of Age to any Issuing Officer and request a Maryland Minor Work Permit.

A new permit must be acquired for each job.

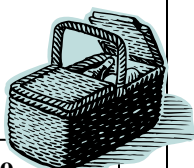
