Have you ever thought of an internship? Career Connections begins the exploration of careers at the freshman level. Understanding yourself and what you do best is the first step in career awareness. The academy program encourages students to develop their skills and interests by taking courses in an area of concentration. The Career Pathways book is available through guidance and advisory to begin to define what courses should be taken to develop a career pathway. The internship, which planning begins during their sophomore year, requires courses to be taken as a prerequisite before their senior year. Feel free to talk to your counselor, advisor or Ms. Sarah Totten, Career Coordinator, to begin exploring career pathways. **Eligibility Requirements:**

- be in your junior year of high school when applying;
  - have successfully earned two credits in science and mathematics, all with grades B or higher;
  - have an overall, unweighted grade point average of 3.0 or higher (based on a 4.0 maximum). If you have a GPA of 2.5-3.0 you may apply, but there is an additional requirement. (refer to the application on-line);
  - be sixteen years of age or older, and a U.S. citizen or resident alien. There are no waivers to this requirement. Resident aliens must provide a copy of their Permanent Resident Card as part of the application process;
  - be covered by health insurance. If you are not covered by health insurance, you may not participate in the student intern program.
- Apply on-line to the Werner H. Kirsten Student Intern Program at the National Cancer Institute at Frederick, Frederick, Maryland. This program is designed to expose high school seniors to research and administrative management in a health care environment. Interns experience the basic methods of biomedical research through hands-on laboratory training or support projects in budget personnel, information technology graphics and media.




Additionally, all students who complete an application will be interviewed by a Service Academy Review Board, which consists of distinguished military and academic leaders from your community. 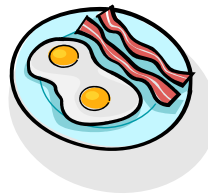
