 - E - "Every Place and Time Counts!"



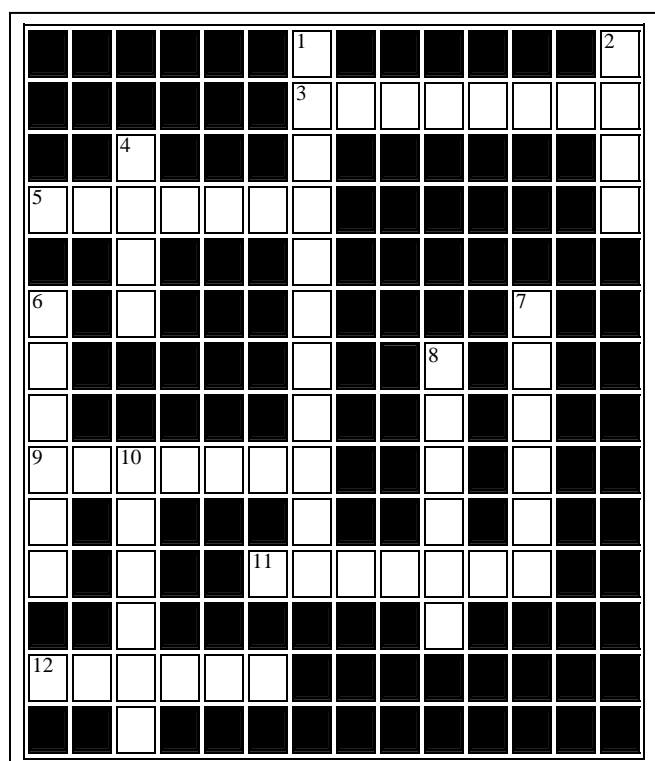

Students also have the opportunity to participate in the Student Government Association, SHOUT (Students Helping Others Understand Themselves), and Twister News Live, the school's live morning news broadcast.

The National Honor Society promotes student responsibility and leadership by requiring a 3.75 unweighted grade point average and community service.
