After more than a year of providing all of our services remotely, the Carroll County Family Support Center is looking forward to a summer of activities and a return to programs in the center this fall. Despite the pandemic, we saw an increase in both enrollment and participation in the program, including GED and ESOL classes, parenting classes, daily PACT, health presentations, and Parent Leadership meetings.
