Examples of Syllabus Language for Second-Chance Learning

Things to think about when creating your syllabus for second-chance learning.

- 1. What type of form or requirement must a student complete in order to take advantage of second-chance learning?
- 2. How long does the student have to complete the re-learning opportunities?
- 3. What types of assessments/assignments will be eligible for second-chance learning?
- 4. Should all homework and/or classwork (formative) assignments have been submitted in order to qualify for second-chance learning?
- 5. How many opportunities will a student be granted to retake/redo a given assignment/assessment? Ideally, a student would be given one opportunity for each assessment/assignment that qualifies for second-chance learning. A teacher is encouraged not to limit second-chance learning opportunities to just one per quarter.

Students will be allowed a second-chance learning opportunity on the following type(s) of assignments: <u>summative assessments and projects</u>. Under certain circumstances, additional assignments/assessments may qualify for second-chance learning at the discretion of the teacher. If the redo/retake grade is higher than the original grade, it will replace the original grade. Second-chance learning is not meant to be used as a regular practice by a student or as a substitute for lack of preparation.
