The Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) Student Scholarship is funded through donations and fundraising events held in the local Baltimore area by members of the Industry Applications Society. The award is given annually to the graduating high school senior from the greater Baltimore area who best demonstrates their academic ability and desire to pursue excellence in the electrical engineering community. This is a cash gift of \$1,000 per year for up to four years, and is intended to provide cash assistance for books, materials, IT equipment or other necessary items to complete their college education. Students, once awarded, are required to maintain active full-time enrollment in an undergraduate electrical engineering or related curriculum. Annually, students must submit proof of enrollment at an accredited engineering academic institution and proof of student membership in IEEE.
