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### Our School

Manchester Valley opened its doors to 580 9<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> grade students on August 25, 2009. Our first graduating class was the Class of 2011. At the conclusion of the 2016 school year neighboring North Carroll High School was closed and students were redistricted to Manchester Valley High School.

We employ a system of letter grades to measure student progress. GPA and rank may be reported as weighted and un-weighted and will be indicated as such. In our weighted system, AP, Transcribed and Honors courses are given additional value on a 4.0 scale.

### Course levels & course numbers

Manchester Valley High School has three levels of courses: Academic, Honors, and AP/Transcribed courses. We have 43 courses available at the Honors level and 17 AP level. The level of each course is designated by the following number, found as the last digit in each course number:

**6** - Academic

**8** - Honors or Advanced Academic

**9** - AP (Advanced Placement) and Transcribed

### Advanced Placement Courses

AP Language & Composition, AP Literature & Composition, AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Physics, AP Environmental Studies, AP Human Geography AP US History, AP World History, AP European History, AP US Government, AP Psychology, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Art Studio, AP Spanish Language, AP Statistics

### Schedule

Manchester Valley students can earn a maximum of eight credits per year. We operate on a semester / block schedule (80 min. class periods), allowing four courses per day, per semester. Half credit courses are completed in nine weeks and one credit courses in eighteen weeks. A small number of courses run *all year* on an alternating, every-other-day schedule. A 30-minute flex mod, called S.E.T. (Student Enrichment Time) is provided to students in between mod 1 and mod 2.

**Student Activities and Programs**

Manchester Valley High School offers a broad program of interscholastic sports that offer equal opportunities for male and female athletes. Several sports have freshmen, junior varsity and varsity designations. We also offer Corollary sports and over 25 active clubs and organizations, of which a comprehensive list is available upon request.

**Graduation Requirements**

- English 4 credits - Must include English 9, 10, 11 or AP Lang, 12 or AP Lit
- Social Studies 3 credits - Must include Government, U.S. History, and World History
- Science 3 credits - Must include Biology and two additional lab sciences
- Mathematics 4 credits - Two credits of Algebra and 1 credit of Geometry (Alg II or higher math must be taken during the senior year)
- Physical Education 1 credit
- Health Education .5 credit
- Fine Arts 1 credit
- Technology Education 1 credit
- Financial Literacy .5 credit

Students must complete **one** of the following programs:

- 2 credits of the same world language **AND/OR**
- 4-9 credits in a state-approved Career and Technology Program **AND/OR**
- 2 credits of advanced technology courses

Finally, students must earn the following: twenty five credits; four credits beyond the 11<sup>th</sup> grade; four years of high school enrollment; minimum state scoring standards on High School Assessments; 75 service learning hours.
